### Definitions of "Upgrades" as a verb

- *Give a promotion to or assign to a higher position.*
- *Get better travel conditions.*
- *Rate higher; raise in value or esteem.*
- *Give better travel conditions to.*

- elevate** Raise the axis of (a piece of artillery) to increase its range.

*Some regulation is still required to **promote** competition.*
- raise** Raise in rank or condition.  
*Divers have located and hope to **raise** the submarine.*

<b><u>enrich</u></b>	Make (someone) wealthy or wealthier. <i>Top party members had <b>enriched</b> themselves.</i>
<b>exalt</b>	Make noble in character; dignify. <i>The party will continue to <b>exalt</b> their hero.</i>
<b>forwarding</b>	The advancement of some enterprise. <i>His experience in marketing resulted in the <b>forwarding</b> of his career.</i>
<b>furtherance</b>	Encouragement of the progress or growth or acceptance of something. <i>The court held that the union's acts were not in <b>furtherance</b> of a trade dispute.</i>
<b>improve</b>	Achieve or produce something better than. <i>Communications <b>improved</b> during the 18th century.</i>
<b>increase</b>	A change resulting in an increase. <i>Some <b>increase</b> in inflation is expected.</i>
<b><u>industrialization</u></b>	The development of industries in a country or region on a wide scale. <i>These developing countries have undergone rapid <b>industrialization</b>.</i>
<b>industrialize</b>	Develop industry; become industrial. <i>The country needs to <b>industrialize</b> to create both exports and jobs.</i>
<b>liberalize</b>	Become more liberal. <i>Several agreements to <b>liberalize</b> trade were signed.</i>
<b>mechanization</b>	The process of supplying a military force with modern weapons and vehicles. <i>With the increasing <b>mechanization</b> of agriculture far fewer farmers are raising donkeys.</i>
<b><u>modernize</u></b>	Become technologically advanced. <i>He <b>modernized</b> the health service.</i>
<b>mounting</b>	The action of mounting something. <i>He pulled the curtain rail from its <b>mounting</b>.</i>
<b><u>precipitate</u></b>	A substance precipitated from a solution. <i>Cell proteins were then <b>precipitated</b> and washed in 10 trichloroacetic acid.</i>
<b>preferment</b>	The act of preferring. <i>The <b>preferment</b> went to the younger candidate.</i>
<b>progress</b>	Cause a task or undertaking to make progress. <i>As the century <b>progressed</b> the quality of telescopes improved.</i>
<b>promotion</b>	A sporting event, especially a series of boxing matches, staged for profit. <i>She's the <b>promotions</b> manager for the museum.</i>



<b>raise</b>	Multiply a number by itself a specified number of times 8 is 2 raised to the power 3. <i>With support for partner s bid suit you <b>raise</b> him to game in it.</i>
<b>redecorate</b>	Redo the decoration of an apartment or house. <i>You will have to <b>redecorate</b> the room afterwards.</i>
<b><u>refurbish</u></b>	Make brighter and prettier. <i>We <b>refurbished</b> the guest wing.</i>
<b>renovate</b>	Give new life or energy to. <i>This will <b>renovate</b> my spirits.</i>
<b>rise</b>	Rise to one s feet. <i>The officer was a man of great courage who had <b>risen</b> from the ranks.</i>
<b>sophisticate</b>	Make someone or something more sophisticated. <i>She ll <b>sophisticate</b> in three languages.</i>
<b><u>surge</u></b>	A sudden large increase, typically a temporary one. <i>Stimulated a <b>surge</b> of speculation.</i>
<b><u>urbanization</u></b>	The condition of being urbanized. <i>Public opposition to the <b>urbanization</b> of the countryside.</i>
