matriculate A person who has matriculated.

**postgraduate** A student engaged in a postgraduate course.

pupil A trainee barrister.

They are former **pupil**s of the school.

scholastic Of or relating to the philosophical doctrine of scholasticism.

To distinguish between them is little more than a **scholastic** exercise.

schoolmaster An experienced horse that is used to train or give confidence to

inexperienced riders or horses.

semester Half a year; a period of 6 months.

The opening week of Harvard's autumn **semester**.

**sophomore** A second-year university or high-school student.

Freshmen performed better than either **sophomore**s or juniors.

teach Work as a teacher.

trainee

He came one day each week to **teach** painting.

teaching Ideas or principles taught by an authority.

*I went into teaching because I like working with children.* 

**top** Reach the top of a hill or other elevation.

He stared as she buttoned her **top**.

A person undergoing training for a particular job or profession.

**Trainee** solicitors.

Denoting or relating to an undergraduate.
