Associations of "Upper class" (30 Words)

alumnus	A former member of a group, company, or organization. <i>A Royal Ballet alumnus.</i>
attendance	The frequency with which a person is present. <i>A student s attendance is an important factor in her grade.</i>
bookworm	A person who pays more attention to formal rules and book learning than they merit.
college	The body of faculty and students of a college. <i>Colleges of further education.</i>
collegian	A student (or former student) at a college or university.
course	A procedure adopted to deal with a situation. <i>She prepared a three course meal.</i>
diploma	An official document or charter.
disciple	A follower or pupil of a teacher, leader, or philosopher. <i>A disciple of Rousseau.</i>
elevation	A high place or position. <i>An elevation of 300 metres.</i>
enrol	Enter (a deed or other document) among the rolls of a court of justice. <i>He enrolled in drama school.</i>
grad	A person who has received a degree from a school (high school or college or university).
graduate	A person who has successfully completed a course of study or training especially a person who has been awarded an undergraduate or first academic degree. <i>She is 19 a graduate of Lincoln High.</i>
graduated	(of an instrument or container) marked with units of measurement. <i>A 15 ml graduated tube.</i>

graduation	The act of arranging in grades. <i>The ruler had 16 graduations per inch.</i>
homeroom	A classroom in which all students in a particular grade (or in a division of a grade) meet at certain times under the supervision of a teacher who takes attendance and does other administrative business.
lecturer	A public lecturer at certain universities. <i>A senior lecturer in surgery at Leeds University.</i>
matriculate	A person who has matriculated. <i>They had recently matriculated as undergraduates at Jesus College.</i>
postgraduate	A student engaged in a postgraduate course. <i>A postgraduate degree.</i>
pupil	A trainee barrister. <i>They are former pupils of the school.</i>
scholastic	Of or relating to the philosophical doctrine of scholasticism. <i>To distinguish between them is little more than a scholastic exercise.</i>
schoolmaster	An experienced horse that is used to train or give confidence to inexperienced riders or horses.
semester	Half a year; a period of 6 months. <i>The opening week of Harvard's autumn semester.</i>
sophomore	A second-year university or high-school student. <i>Freshmen performed better than either sophomores or juniors.</i>
teach	Work as a teacher. <i>He came one day each week to teach painting.</i>
teaching	Ideas or principles taught by an authority. <i>I went into teaching because I like working with children.</i>
top	Reach the top of a hill or other elevation. <i>He stared as she buttoned her top.</i>
trainee	A person undergoing training for a particular job or profession. <i>Trainee solicitors.</i>
undergraduate	Denoting or relating to an undergraduate. <i>An undergraduate degree.</i>
university	The body of faculty and students at a university. <i>His daughter is at university.</i>
valedictorian	The student with the best grades who usually delivers the valedictory address at commencement.
