| <b>alumnus</b>            | A former member of a group, company, or organization.<br><i>A Royal Ballet <b>alumnus</b>.</i>   |
| <b>attendance</b>         | The frequency with which a person is present.<br><i>A student s <b>attendance</b> is an important factor in her grade.</i>   |
| <b>bookworm</b>           | A person who pays more attention to formal rules and book learning than they merit.  |
| <b>college</b>            | The body of faculty and students of a college.<br><i><b>Colleges</b> of further education.</i>   |
| <b>collegian</b>          | A student (or former student) at a college or university.  |
| <b>course</b>             | A procedure adopted to deal with a situation.<br><i>She prepared a three <b>course</b> meal.</i>   |
| <b>diploma</b>            | An official document or charter.   |
| <a href="#">disciple</a>  | A follower or pupil of a teacher, leader, or philosopher.<br><i>A <b>disciple</b> of Rousseau.</i>   |
| <a href="#">elevation</a> | A high place or position.<br><i>An <b>elevation</b> of 300 metres.</i>   |
| <b>enrol</b>              | Enter (a deed or other document) among the rolls of a court of justice.<br><i>He <b>enrolled</b> in drama school.</i>  |
| <b>grad</b>               | A person who has received a degree from a school (high school or college or university).   |
| <a href="#">graduate</a>  | A person who has successfully completed a course of study or training especially a person who has been awarded an undergraduate or first academic degree.<br><i>She is 19 a <b>graduate</b> of Lincoln High.</i> |
| <b>graduated</b>          | (of an instrument or container) marked with units of measurement.<br><i>A 15 ml <b>graduated</b> tube.</i>   |

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| <b>graduation</b>    | The act of arranging in grades.<br><i>The ruler had 16 <b>graduations</b> per inch.</i>   |
| <b>homeroom</b>      | A classroom in which all students in a particular grade (or in a division of a grade) meet at certain times under the supervision of a teacher who takes attendance and does other administrative business. |
| <b>lecturer</b>      | A public lecturer at certain universities.<br><i>A senior <b>lecturer</b> in surgery at Leeds University.</i>   |
| <b>matriculate</b>   | A person who has matriculated.<br><i>They had recently <b>matriculated</b> as undergraduates at Jesus College.</i>  |
| <b>postgraduate</b>  | A student engaged in a postgraduate course.<br><i>A <b>postgraduate</b> degree.</i>   |
| <b>pupil</b>         | A trainee barrister.<br><i>They are former <b>pupils</b> of the school.</i>   |
| <b>scholastic</b>    | Of or relating to the philosophical doctrine of scholasticism.<br><i>To distinguish between them is little more than a <b>scholastic</b> exercise.</i>  |
| <b>schoolmaster</b>  | An experienced horse that is used to train or give confidence to inexperienced riders or horses.  |
| <b>semester</b>      | Half a year; a period of 6 months.<br><i>The opening week of Harvard's autumn <b>semester</b>.</i>  |
| <b>sophomore</b>     | A second-year university or high-school student.<br><i>Freshmen performed better than either <b>sophomores</b> or juniors.</i>  |
| <b>teach</b>         | Work as a teacher.<br><i>He came one day each week to <b>teach</b> painting.</i>  |
| <b>teaching</b>      | Ideas or principles taught by an authority.<br><i>I went into <b>teaching</b> because I like working with children.</i>   |
| <b>top</b>           | Reach the top of a hill or other elevation.<br><i>He stared as she buttoned her <b>top</b>.</i>   |
| <b>trainee</b>       | A person undergoing training for a particular job or profession.<br><i><b>Trainee</b> solicitors.</i>   |
| <b>undergraduate</b> | Denoting or relating to an undergraduate.<br><i>An <b>undergraduate</b> degree.</i>   |
| <b>university</b>    | The body of faculty and students at a university.<br><i>His daughter is at <b>university</b>.</i>   |
| <b>valedictorian</b> | The student with the best grades who usually delivers the valedictory address at commencement.  |
