premium	Having or reflecting superior quality or value. <i>Premium gasoline at a premium price.</i>

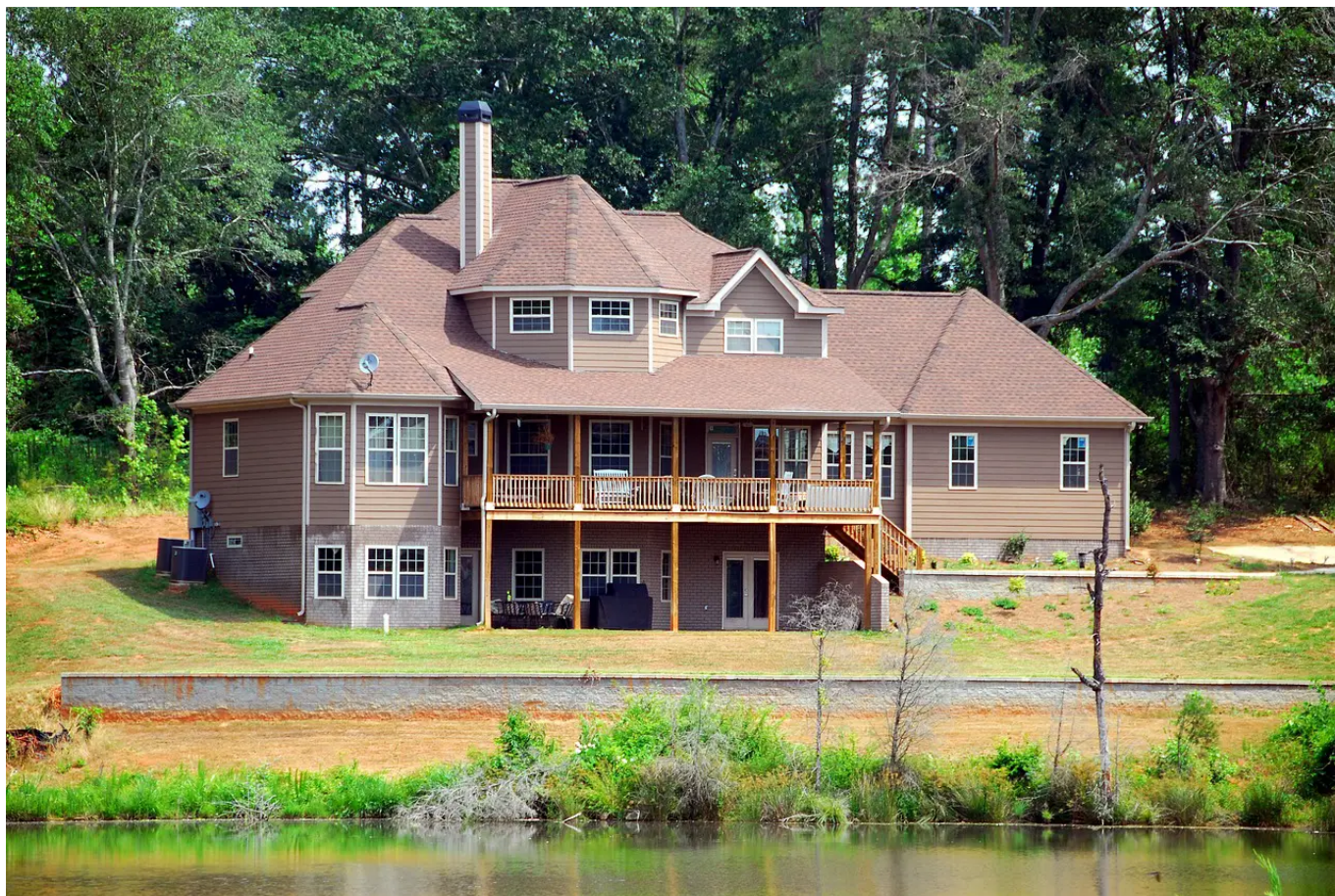
prime	Having all the typical characteristics of something. <i>Prime cuts of meat.</i>

select	Selected or chosen for special qualifications. <i>He joined his select team of young Intelligence operatives.</i>
superior	Of high or superior quality or performance. <i>I felt superior to any accusation of anti-Semitism.</i>
top	Situated at the top or highest position. <i>The car has a top speed of 125 mph.</i>
top-quality	Surpassing in quality.
upper-class	Occupying the highest socioeconomic position in a society.

luxuriously	In an indulgently luxurious manner.
millionaire	A person whose material wealth is valued at more than a million dollars. <i>He is now a millionaire several times over.</i>
opulent	Wealthy. <i>The opulent comfort of a limousine.</i>
plenteous	Affording an abundant supply. <i>A plenteous grape harvest.</i>
plentiful	Existing in great number or quantity. <i>Rhinoceroses were once plentiful here.</i>
plentitude	A full supply.
profusion	An abundance or large quantity of something. <i>The profusion of detail.</i>
prosper	Flourish physically; grow strong and healthy. <i>Areas where grey squirrels cannot prosper.</i>
prosperity	The condition of prospering; having good fortune. <i>A long period of peace and prosperity.</i>
prosperous	Successful in material terms; flourishing financially. <i>Prosperous middle class professionals.</i>
rich	Marked by richness and fullness of flavor. <i>Rich countries can afford to spend money on the environment.</i>
success	An attainment that is successful. <i>There is a thin line between success and failure.</i>

Grow vigorously.

*Education groups **thrive** on organization.*

thriving

Prosperous and growing; flourishing.

*A **thriving** tourist center.*

wealth

Property that has economic utility: a monetary value or an exchange value.

*Some people buy boats and cars to display their **wealth**.*

wealthy

Having a great deal of money, resources, or assets; rich.

*The burden of taxation on the **wealthy**.*
