<b>prime</b>	Having all the typical characteristics of something. <i><b>Prime</b> cuts of meat.</i>
<b>ritzy</b>	Expensively stylish. <i>The <b>ritzy</b> Plaza Hotel.</i>
<b>select</b>	Selected or chosen for special qualifications. <i>He joined his <b>select</b> team of young Intelligence operatives.</i>
<b>superior</b>	Of high or superior quality or performance. <i>I felt <b>superior</b> to any accusation of anti-Semitism.</i>
<b>top</b>	Situated at the top or highest position. <i>The car has a <b>top</b> speed of 125 mph.</i>
<b>top-quality</b>	Surpassing in quality.
<b>upper-class</b>	Occupying the highest socioeconomic position in a society.

<b>deluxe</b>	Luxurious or sumptuous; of a superior kind. <i>A <b>deluxe</b> car.</i>
<b>flourishing</b>	Developing rapidly and successfully; thriving. <i>A <b>flourishing</b> career.</i>
<b>healthiness</b>	The state of being vigorous and free from bodily or mental disease.
<b>heiress</b>	A woman inheriting and continuing the legacy of a predecessor. <i>She was <b>heiress</b> to a 32 million textile fortune.</i>
<b>landlady</b>	A woman who keeps lodgings, a boarding house, or a pub.
<b>luxuriant</b>	Produced or growing in extreme abundance. <i>Forests of dark <b>luxuriant</b> foliage.</i>
<b>luxurious</b>	Displaying luxury and furnishing gratification to the senses. <i>Enjoyed a <b>luxurious</b> suite with a crystal chandelier and thick oriental rugs.</i>
<b>luxuriously</b>	In an indulgently luxurious manner.
<b>millionaire</b>	A person whose material wealth is valued at more than a million dollars. <i>He is now a <b>millionaire</b> several times over.</i>
<b>opulent</b>	Wealthy. <i>The <b>opulent</b> comfort of a limousine.</i>
<b>plenteous</b>	Affording an abundant supply. <i>A <b>plenteous</b> grape harvest.</i>
<b>plentiful</b>	Existing in great number or quantity. <i>Rhinoceroses were once <b>plentiful</b> here.</i>
<b>plentitude</b>	A full supply.
<b>profusion</b>	An abundance or large quantity of something. <i>The <b>profusion</b> of detail.</i>
<b>prosper</b>	Flourish physically; grow strong and healthy. <i>Areas where grey squirrels cannot <b>prosper</b>.</i>
<b>prosperity</b>	The condition of prospering; having good fortune. <i>A long period of peace and <b>prosperity</b>.</i>
<b>prosperous</b>	Successful in material terms; flourishing financially. <i><b>Prosperous</b> middle class professionals.</i>
<b>rich</b>	Marked by richness and fullness of flavor. <i><b>Rich</b> countries can afford to spend money on the environment.</i>
<b>success</b>	An attainment that is successful. <i>There is a thin line between <b>success</b> and failure.</i>

**thrive**

Grow vigorously.  
*Education groups **thrive** on organization.*

**thriving**

Prosperous and growing; flourishing.  
*A **thriving** tourist center.*

**wealth**

Property that has economic utility: a monetary value or an exchange value.  
*Some people buy boats and cars to display their **wealth**.*

**wealthy**

Having a great deal of money, resources, or assets; rich.  
*The burden of taxation on the **wealthy**.*
