Being in a tense state.

The government has done nothing to ease restrictions and restive

Strengthened by the application of stress during manufacture

prestressed.

stressed He dropped out of the race clearly distressed and having

Pronounced with relatively tense tongue muscles e g the vowel

Characterized by unrest or disorder or insubordination. troubled

under stress Located below or beneath something else.

Relating to bodily unease that causes discomfort.

uneasy An **uneasy** coalition government.

worried sick Mentally upset over possible misfortune or danger etc.

Elision after a **stressed** syllable.

Make more temperate acceptable or suitable by adding something else

temper moderate.

Become stretched or tense or taut.

Tense piano strings.

troubled Beset by problems or difficulties.

These **troubled** areas.

Lacking a sense of security or affording no ease or reassurance.

An **uneasy** silence fell on the group.

volatility

The property of changing readily from a solid or liquid to a vapor.

A week of historic stock market volatility.
