<b>abreast</b>	Alongside or level with something. <i>The path was wide enough for two people to walk <b>abreast</b>.</i>
<a href="#">alongside</a>	Side by side.
<a href="#">chic</a>	Elegance by virtue of being fashionable. <i>She looked every inch the <b>chic</b> Frenchwoman.</i>
<b>craze</b>	An enthusiasm for a particular activity or object which appears suddenly and achieves widespread but short-lived popularity. <i><b>Crazed</b> by hunger the population began to turn on the rebels.</i>
<b>current</b>	A quantity representing the rate of flow of electric charge, usually measured in amperes. <i>The other meaning of the word is still <b>current</b>.</i>
<a href="#">dapper</a>	Marked by up-to-dateness in dress and manners. <i>A <b>dapper</b> young man.</i>
<b>fad</b>	An intense and widely shared enthusiasm for something, especially one that is short-lived; a craze. <i>His <b>fads</b> about the type of coffee he must have.</i>
<b>faddish</b>	Intensely fashionable for a short time. <i>Superficial <b>faddish</b> approaches to spirituality.</i>
<b>fashion</b>	A popular or the latest style of clothing, hair, decoration, or behaviour. <i>The latest Parisian <b>fashions</b>.</i>
<a href="#">fashionable</a>	Of a place frequented by fashionable people. <i>They risked being scoffed at by their more <b>fashionable</b> friends.</i>
<b>inimitable</b>	So good or unusual as to be impossible to copy; unique. <i>They took the charts by storm with their <b>inimitable</b> style.</i>
<b>lately</b>	In the recent past. <i><b>Lately</b> the rules have been enforced.</i>

<b>latest</b>	In the current fashion or style. <i>Have you heard the <b>latest</b>.</i>
<b>modern</b>	Belonging to the modern era since the Middle Ages. <i>Their offices are in a <b>modern</b> skyscraper.</i>
<b>modernity</b>	The quality of being current or of the present. <i>Hobbes was the genius of <b>modernity</b>.</i>
<b>modish</b>	Conforming to or following what is currently popular and fashionable. <i>It seems sad that such a scholar should feel compelled to use this <b>modish</b> jargon.</i>
<b>natty</b>	Well designed; clever. <i>A <b>natty</b> blue blazer.</i>
<b>newfangled</b>	Gratuitously new. <i><b>Newfangled</b> ideas.</i>
<b>newly</b>	Very recently. <i>A <b>newly</b> arranged hairdo.</i>
<b>popular</b>	(of a belief or attitude) held by the majority of the general public. <i>Cabbage patch dolls are no longer <b>popular</b>.</i>
<b>present</b>	Formally present a debutante a representative of a country etc. <i>We <b>presented</b> the arguments to him.</i>
<b>presently</b>	At the present time; now. <i>She will arrive <b>presently</b>.</i>
<b>recency</b>	A time immediately before the present.
<b>recent</b>	Approximately the last 10,000 years. <i><b>Recent</b> buds on the apple trees.</i>
<b>recently</b>	At a recent time; not long ago. <i>I <b>recently</b> bought a CD player.</i>
<b>stylish</b>	Neat, confident, and skilful. <i>A <b>stylish</b> batsman.</i>
<b>unconventional</b>	Not based on or conforming to what is generally done or believed. <i>His <b>unconventional</b> approach to life.</i>
<b>urbanity</b>	Courteousness and refinement of manner. <i>A picture of banal <b>urbanity</b>.</i>
<b>vogue</b>	The popular taste at a given time. <i>Citizenship was to be the government s <b>vogue</b> word.</i>
<b>whereabouts</b>	The place where someone or something is. <i><b>Whereabouts</b> do you come from.</i>
