

puck A vulcanized rubber disk 3 inches in diameter that is used instead of a


ball in ice hockey.

corruption.

rogue A dishonest or unprincipled man. You are a **rogue** and an embezzler.

ruffian A violent criminal or troublemaker.

scamp A person, especially a child, who is mischievous in a likeable or amusing way.

That man was a **scamp** a damn thief.

scoundrel A wicked or evil person; someone who does evil deliberately.

That **scoundrel** sets a bad example for the other young men.
