- effectiveness** Capacity to produce strong physiological or chemical effects.

- efficacy** The ability to produce a desired or intended result.
*Concern about the safety and **efficacy** of the vaccine.*

- fitness** Fitness to traverse the seas.
*Disease and lack of **fitness** are closely related.*
- functionality** The range of operations that can be run on a computer or other electronic system.
*I like the feel and **functionality** of this bakeware.*
- handiness** The quality of being at hand when needed.
*He can do any sort of work requiring **handiness** and dexterity.*
- neatness** The state of being neat and smart and trim.
*His obsessive **neatness**.*
- practicality** Concerned with actual use rather than theoretical possibilities.
*There are still major doubts about the **practicality** of the proposal.*
- serviceability** The quality of being able to provide good service.
- use** The action of using something or the state of being used for a purpose.
*Theatre owners were charging too much for the **use** of their venues.*
- utility** A utility vehicle.
*A handy **utility** for converting one graphics file type to another.*

| likelihood | The state or fact of something's being likely; probability. <i>Situations where there is a likelihood of violence.</i> |
| operational | Relating to or in accordance with operationalism. <i>De facto apartheid is still operational even in the new African nations.</i> |
| portable | A small transportable building used as a classroom. <i>A portable television set.</i> |
| possibility | A thing that may be chosen or done out of several possible alternatives. <i>There is a possibility that his sense of smell has been impaired.</i> |
| possible | The highest possible score especially in a shooting competition. <i>They were living right at the edge of the possible.</i> |
| potential | Latent qualities or abilities that may be developed and lead to future success or usefulness. <i>Pesticides with the potential to cause cancer.</i> |
| practical | Having or put to a practical purpose or use. <i>I'm merely being practical we must find a ground floor flat.</i> |
| pragmatic | Relating to pragmatics. <i>A pragmatic approach to politics.</i> |
