- (economics) a measure that is to be maximized in any situation involving choice.



utility program	The service (electric power or water or transportation) provided by a public utility.






Usage Examples of "Utilities" as a noun

- Capable of substituting in any of several positions on a team.





advantageous	Giving an advantage. We are in an advantageous position.
availability	The state of not being currently involved in a sexual or romantic relationship. They enquired as to my availability for a game the following evening.
beneficial	Resulting in good; favourable or advantageous. The appellant had no beneficial interest in the house.
clinically	In a way that causes observable and recognizable symptoms. The clinically clean kitchen design is curiously devoid of atmosphere.
effectively	Actually but not officially or explicitly. <i>Effectively</i> this means that companies will be able to avoid regulations.



effectual	Producing or capable of producing an intended result or having a striking effect-LewisMumford. <i>His complaint proved to be effectual in bringing action.</i>
<u>efficacious</u>	Producing or capable of producing an intended result or having a striking effect. This treatment was efficacious in some cases.
facilitation	(neurophysiology) phenomenon that occurs when two or more neural impulses that alone are not enough to trigger a response in a neuron combine to trigger an action potential. <i>Third party facilitation seeks to promote the resolution of conflict.</i>
facilitative	Freeing from difficulty or impediment. <i>Facilitative</i> changes in the economic structure.
function	Mathematics a mathematical relation such that each element of a given set the domain of the function is associated with an element of another set the range of the function. <i>The function</i> of a teacher.
functional	Designed for or adapted to a function or use. <i>Functional diarrhoea.</i>
gainful	Serving to increase wealth or resources; providing money or other benefit. <i>He soon found gainful employment</i> .
handled	Having a handle or handles, especially of a specified type or number. <i>A two handled cup.</i>
helpful	Providing assistance or serving a useful function. <i>Helpful</i> staff.
improving	Giving moral or intellectual benefit. A large improving picture hung opposite.
invaluable	Having incalculable monetary, intellectual, or spiritual worth. An invaluable source of information.
misappropriate	Dishonestly or unfairly take (something, especially money, belonging to another) for one's own use. The report revealed that department officials had misappropriate d funds.
<u>operational</u>	Relating to or in accordance with operationalism. <i>De facto apartheid is still operational even in the new African nations.</i>
paying	For which money is paid. A paying job.



<u>pragmatic</u>	Relating to pragmatics. A matter of fact or pragmatic approach to the problem.
<u>profitable</u>	Beneficial; useful. The investments were extremely profitable .
<u>readily</u>	Without much difficulty. <i>He readily admits that the new car surpasses its predecessors.</i>
recyclable	Able to be recycled. <i>The containers are recyclable</i> .
reusable	An item which can be used again or more than once. <i>Reusable</i> shopping bags.
serviceable	Intended or able to serve a purpose without elaboration. A serviceable kitchen gadget.
undertaking	The action of undertaking to do something. I give an undertaking that we shall proceed with the legislation.
useful	Having a useful function. The girl felt motherly and useful .
utilitarian	Relating to or adhering to the doctrine of utilitarianism. <i>Plain utilitarian kitchenware.</i>
utilizable	Capable of being put to a profitable or practical use.
<u>utilize</u>	Put into service; make work or employ for a particular purpose or for its inherent or natural purpose. <i>How do you utilize this tool.</i>
