<b>beneficial</b>	Resulting in good; favourable or advantageous. <i>The appellant had no <b>beneficial</b> interest in the house.</i>
<b>clinically</b>	In a way that causes observable and recognizable symptoms. <i>The <b>clinically</b> clean kitchen design is curiously devoid of atmosphere.</i>
<b>effectively</b>	Actually but not officially or explicitly. <i><b>Effectively</b> this means that companies will be able to avoid regulations.</i>

<b>effectual</b>	Producing or capable of producing an intended result or having a striking effect-LewisMumford. <i>His complaint proved to be <b>effectual</b> in bringing action.</i>
<b>efficacious</b>	Producing or capable of producing an intended result or having a striking effect. <i>This treatment was <b>efficacious</b> in some cases.</i>
<b>facilitation</b>	(neurophysiology) phenomenon that occurs when two or more neural impulses that alone are not enough to trigger a response in a neuron combine to trigger an action potential. <i>Third party <b>facilitation</b> seeks to promote the resolution of conflict.</i>
<b>facilitative</b>	Freeing from difficulty or impediment. <i><b>Facilitative</b> changes in the economic structure.</i>
<b>function</b>	Mathematics a mathematical relation such that each element of a given set the domain of the function is associated with an element of another set the range of the function. <i>The <b>function</b> of a teacher.</i>
<b>functional</b>	Designed for or adapted to a function or use. <i><b>Functional</b> diarrhoea.</i>
<b>gainful</b>	Serving to increase wealth or resources; providing money or other benefit. <i>He soon found <b>gainful</b> employment.</i>
<b>handled</b>	Having a handle or handles, especially of a specified type or number. <i>A two <b>handled</b> cup.</i>
<b>helpful</b>	Providing assistance or serving a useful function. <i><b>Helpful</b> staff.</i>
<b>improving</b>	Giving moral or intellectual benefit. <i>A large <b>improving</b> picture hung opposite.</i>
<b>invaluable</b>	Having incalculable monetary, intellectual, or spiritual worth. <i>An <b>invaluable</b> source of information.</i>
<b>misappropriate</b>	Dishonestly or unfairly take (something, especially money, belonging to another) for one's own use. <i>The report revealed that department officials had <b>misappropriated</b> funds.</i>
<b>operational</b>	Relating to or in accordance with operationalism. <i>De facto apartheid is still <b>operational</b> even in the new African nations.</i>
<b>paying</b>	For which money is paid. <i>A <b>paying</b> job.</i>



<b><u>pragmatic</u></b>	Relating to pragmatics. <i>A matter of fact or <b>pragmatic</b> approach to the problem.</i>
<b><u>profitable</u></b>	Beneficial; useful. <i>The investments were extremely <b>profitable</b>.</i>
<b><u>readily</u></b>	Without much difficulty. <i>He <b>readily</b> admits that the new car surpasses its predecessors.</i>
<b>recyclable</b>	Able to be recycled. <i>The containers are <b>recyclable</b>.</i>
<b>reusable</b>	An item which can be used again or more than once. <i><b>Reusable</b> shopping bags.</i>
<b>serviceable</b>	Intended or able to serve a purpose without elaboration. <i>A <b>serviceable</b> kitchen gadget.</i>
<b>undertaking</b>	The action of undertaking to do something. <i>I give an <b>undertaking</b> that we shall proceed with the legislation.</i>
<b>useful</b>	Having a useful function. <i>The girl felt motherly and <b>useful</b>.</i>
<b>utilitarian</b>	Relating to or adhering to the doctrine of utilitarianism. <i>Plain <b>utilitarian</b> kitchenware.</i>
<b>utilizable</b>	Capable of being put to a profitable or practical use.
<b><u>utilize</u></b>	Put into service; make work or employ for a particular purpose or for its inherent or natural purpose. <i>How do you <b>utilize</b> this tool.</i>
