beneficial	Resulting in good; favourable or advantageous. <i>The appellant had no beneficial interest in the house.</i>
clinically	In a way that causes observable and recognizable symptoms. <i>The clinically clean kitchen design is curiously devoid of atmosphere.</i>
effectively	Actually but not officially or explicitly. <i>Effectively this means that companies will be able to avoid regulations.</i>

effectual	Producing or capable of producing an intended result or having a striking effect-LewisMumford. <i>His complaint proved to be effectual in bringing action.</i>
efficacious	Producing or capable of producing an intended result or having a striking effect. <i>This treatment was efficacious in some cases.</i>
facilitation	(neurophysiology) phenomenon that occurs when two or more neural impulses that alone are not enough to trigger a response in a neuron combine to trigger an action potential. <i>Third party facilitation seeks to promote the resolution of conflict.</i>
facilitative	Freeing from difficulty or impediment. <i>Facilitative changes in the economic structure.</i>
function	Mathematics a mathematical relation such that each element of a given set the domain of the function is associated with an element of another set the range of the function. <i>The function of a teacher.</i>
functional	Designed for or adapted to a function or use. <i>Functional diarrhoea.</i>
gainful	Serving to increase wealth or resources; providing money or other benefit. <i>He soon found gainful employment.</i>
handled	Having a handle or handles, especially of a specified type or number. <i>A two handled cup.</i>
helpful	Providing assistance or serving a useful function. <i>Helpful staff.</i>
improving	Giving moral or intellectual benefit. <i>A large improving picture hung opposite.</i>
invaluable	Having incalculable monetary, intellectual, or spiritual worth. <i>An invaluable source of information.</i>
misappropriate	Dishonestly or unfairly take (something, especially money, belonging to another) for one's own use. <i>The report revealed that department officials had misappropriated funds.</i>
operational	Relating to or in accordance with operationalism. <i>De facto apartheid is still operational even in the new African nations.</i>
paying	For which money is paid. <i>A paying job.</i>

<u>pragmatic</u>	Relating to pragmatics. <i>A matter of fact or pragmatic approach to the problem.</i>
<u>profitable</u>	Beneficial; useful. <i>The investments were extremely profitable.</i>
<u>readily</u>	Without much difficulty. <i>He readily admits that the new car surpasses its predecessors.</i>
recyclable	Able to be recycled. <i>The containers are recyclable.</i>
reusable	An item which can be used again or more than once. <i>Reusable shopping bags.</i>
serviceable	Intended or able to serve a purpose without elaboration. <i>A serviceable kitchen gadget.</i>
undertaking	The action of undertaking to do something. <i>I give an undertaking that we shall proceed with the legislation.</i>
useful	Having a useful function. <i>The girl felt motherly and useful.</i>
utilitarian	Relating to or adhering to the doctrine of utilitarianism. <i>Plain utilitarian kitchenware.</i>
utilizable	Capable of being put to a profitable or practical use.
<u>utilize</u>	Put into service; make work or employ for a particular purpose or for its inherent or natural purpose. <i>How do you utilize this tool.</i>
