service	A company or agency that performs a public service subject to government regulation. <i>The probation service</i> .
service program	Periodic maintenance on a car or machine.
serviceableness	The quality of being able to provide good service.

working	Serving to permit or facilitate further work or activity. Improvements in living and <b>working</b> conditions.


