look to	Give a certain impression or have a certain outward aspect.
make use of	Put in order or neaten.
milk	Take milk from female mammals. <i>Scientists have found a new way of producing an anti clotting agent by milking a leech.</i>
press into service	Create by pressing.
put to use	Estimate.
resort to	Have recourse to.
take advantage of	Be stricken by an illness, fall victim to an illness.
tap	Make light repeated taps on a surface. <i>The FBI was tapping the phone line of the suspected spy.</i>
turn to account	Channel one's attention, interest, thought, or attention toward or away from something.
use	Habitually do something or be in a certain state or place use only in the past tense. <i>Use your troops well and they will not let you down.</i>
utilise	Put into service; make work or employ for a particular purpose or for its inherent or natural purpose.
