<b>press into service</b>	Create by pressing.
<b>put to use</b>	Estimate.
<b>resort to</b>	Have recourse to.
<b>take advantage of</b>	Be stricken by an illness, fall victim to an illness.
<b>tap</b>	Make light repeated taps on a surface. <i>The FBI was <b>tapping</b> the phone line of the suspected spy.</i>
<b>turn to account</b>	Channel one's attention, interest, thought, or attention toward or away from something.
<b>use</b>	Habitually do something or be in a certain state or place use only in the past tense. <i><b>Use</b> your troops well and they will not let you down.</i>
<b>utilise</b>	Put into service; make work or employ for a particular purpose or for its inherent or natural purpose.
