### Definitions of "Utopia" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “utopia” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A book written by Sir Thomas More (1516) describing the perfect society on an imaginary island.*
- *An imaginary place considered to be perfect or ideal.*
- *Ideally perfect state; especially in its social and political and moral aspects.*
- *An imagined place or state of things in which everything is perfect.*
- *A work of fiction describing a utopia.*



## Synonyms of "Utopia" as a noun (14 Words)

<b>bliss</b>	A state of extreme happiness. <i>The <b>bliss</b> of heaven.</i>
<b>eden</b>	Any place of complete bliss and delight and peace.
<b>elysium</b>	A place or condition of ideal happiness.
<b>garden of eden</b>	The flowers or vegetables or fruits or herbs that are cultivated in a garden.
<b>heaven</b>	A place, state, or experience of supreme bliss. <i>Constantine was persuaded that disunity in the Church was displeasing to <b>heaven</b>.</i>
<b>heaven on earth</b>	The abode of God and the angels.
<b>ideal place</b>	Model of excellence or perfection of a kind; one having no equal.
<b>idyll</b>	An episode of such pastoral or romantic charm as to qualify as the subject of a poetic idyll. <i>The rural <b>idyll</b> remains strongly evocative in most industrialized societies.</i>
<b>nirvana</b>	An ideal or idyllic state or place. <i>The days of socialist <b>nirvana</b> in Europe are over.</i>

- paradise** (in some religions) heaven as the ultimate abode of the just.  
*The surrounding countryside is a walker s **paradise**.*
- seventh heaven** One part in seven equal parts.
- shangri-la** Any place of complete bliss and delight and peace.
- sion** An imaginary place considered to be perfect or ideal.
- zion** Originally a stronghold captured by David (the 2nd king of the Israelites); above it was built a temple and later the name extended to the whole hill; finally it became a synonym for the city of Jerusalem.

- anarchist** An advocate of anarchism.  
*An **anarchist** newspaper.*
- anarchy** The organization of society on the basis of voluntary cooperation, without political institutions or hierarchical government; anarchism.  
*He must ensure public order in a country threatened with **anarchy**.*
- bourgeois** A bourgeois person.  
***Bourgeois** society took for granted the sanctity of property.*
- capitalist** Of or relating to capitalism or capitalists.  
*A **capitalist** nation.*
- collective** A collective farm.  
*A **collective** sigh of relief from parents.*
- communist** A member of the communist party.  
*A French **communist** writer.*
- competitive** Involving competition or competitiveness.  
*We offer prompt service at **competitive** rates.*

<b>decentralize</b>	Transfer (control of an activity or organization) to several local offices or authorities rather than one single one. <i>New technology allows companies to <b>decentralize</b> large factories.</i>
<b>decree</b>	The issuing of a decree. <i>The <b>decree</b> guaranteed freedom of assembly.</i>
<b>dreamer</b>	A person who has lived in the US without official authorization since coming to the country as a minor. People of this description who met certain conditions would be eligible for a special immigration status under federal legislation first proposed in 2001. <i>A rebellious young <b>dreamer</b>.</i>
<b>entrepreneur</b>	Someone who organizes a business venture and assumes the risk for it. <i>The music <b>entrepreneur</b> pulled back from financing a screenplay Hopper had written.</i>
<b>firebrand</b>	A piece of wood that has been burned or is burning. <i>A political <b>firebrand</b>.</i>
<b>firmament</b>	The heavens or sky. <i>Thunder shakes the <b>firmament</b>.</i>
<b>heaven</b>	The sky, especially perceived as a vault in which the sun, moon, stars, and planets are situated. <i>Good <b>heavens</b>.</i>
<b>idealistic</b>	Of high moral or intellectual value; elevated in nature or style- Oliver Franks. <i><b>Idealistic</b> young doctors who went to work for the rebels.</i>
<b>imaginary</b>	Existing only in the imagination. <i>A small child s <b>imaginary</b> friends.</i>
<b>libertarian</b>	An advocate of libertarianism. <i>He holds <b>libertarian</b> views on most social issues.</i>
<b>materialistic</b>	Conforming to the standards and conventions of the middle class. <i>We re living in a highly <b>materialistic</b> society.</i>
<b>nationalize</b>	Make national in character or scope. <i>Mitterand <b>nationalized</b> the banks.</i>
<b>nihilist</b>	An advocate of anarchism. <i>It is impossible to argue against a <b>nihilist</b>.</i>
<b>paradise</b>	The abode of Adam and Eve before the Fall in the biblical account of the Creation; the Garden of Eden. <i>Martyrs who die in battle with the ungodly earn instant transmission to <b>paradise</b>.</i>

<b>privatize</b>	Transfer (a business, industry, or service) from public to private ownership and control. <i>The oil industry was <b>privatized</b>.</i>
<b><u>proletariat</u></b>	The lowest class of citizens in ancient Rome. <i>The growth of the industrial <b>proletariat</b>.</i>
<b><u>revolutionary</u></b>	Markedly new or introducing radical change. <i>The <b>revolutionary</b> army.</i>
<b>sacred</b>	Regarded as too valuable to be interfered with; sacrosanct. <i>Saw motherhood as woman s <b>sacred</b> calling.</i>
<b>socialist</b>	Advocating or following the socialist principles. <i>She was a lifelong <b>socialist</b>.</i>
<b><u>sublime</u></b>	Cause a substance to sublime. <i>The ice <b>sublimed</b> away leaving the books dry and undamaged.</i>
<b><u>subversive</u></b>	A subversive person. <i>The government claimed we were <b>subversives</b> or terrorists.</i>
<b>supernal</b>	Of heaven or the spirit. <i><b>Supernal</b> erudition.</i>
<b>welkin</b>	The apparent surface of the imaginary sphere on which celestial bodies appear to be projected.
