- *A book written by Sir Thomas More (1516) describing the perfect society on an imaginary island.*
- *An imaginary place considered to be perfect or ideal.*
- *Ideally perfect state; especially in its social and political and moral aspects.*
- *An imagined place or state of things in which everything is perfect.*
- *A work of fiction describing a utopia.*



Synonyms of "Utopia" as a noun (14 Words)

[bliss](#)

A state of extreme happiness.
*The **bliss** of heaven.*

eden

Any place of complete bliss and delight and peace.

elysium

A place or condition of ideal happiness.

garden of eden

The flowers or vegetables or fruits or herbs that are cultivated in a garden.

heaven

A place, state, or experience of supreme bliss.
*Constantine was persuaded that disunity in the Church was displeasing to **heaven**.*

heaven on earth The abode of God and the angels.

ideal place

Model of excellence or perfection of a kind; one having no equal.

idyll

An episode of such pastoral or romantic charm as to qualify as the subject of a poetic idyll.
*The rural **idyll** remains strongly evocative in most industrialized societies.*

nirvana

An ideal or idyllic state or place.
*The days of socialist **nirvana** in Europe are over.*

<u>paradise</u>	(in some religions) heaven as the ultimate abode of the just. <i>The surrounding countryside is a walker's paradise.</i>
seventh heaven	One part in seven equal parts.
shangri-la	Any place of complete bliss and delight and peace.
sion	An imaginary place considered to be perfect or ideal.
zion	Originally a stronghold captured by David (the 2nd king of the Israelites); above it was built a temple and later the name extended to the whole hill; finally it became a synonym for the city of Jerusalem.

Associations of "Utopia" (30 Words)

<u>anarchist</u>	An advocate of anarchism. <i>An anarchist newspaper.</i>
<u>anarchy</u>	The organization of society on the basis of voluntary cooperation, without political institutions or hierarchical government; anarchism. <i>He must ensure public order in a country threatened with anarchy.</i>
<u>bourgeois</u>	A bourgeois person. <i>Bourgeois society took for granted the sanctity of property.</i>
capitalist	Of or relating to capitalism or capitalists. <i>A capitalist nation.</i>
<u>collective</u>	A collective farm. <i>A collective sigh of relief from parents.</i>
<u>communist</u>	A member of the communist party. <i>A French communist writer.</i>
competitive	Involving competition or competitiveness. <i>We offer prompt service at competitive rates.</i>

decentralize	Transfer (control of an activity or organization) to several local offices or authorities rather than one single one. <i>New technology allows companies to decentralize large factories.</i>
<u>decree</u>	The issuing of a decree. <i>The decree guaranteed freedom of assembly.</i>
<u>dreamer</u>	A person who has lived in the US without official authorization since coming to the country as a minor. People of this description who met certain conditions would be eligible for a special immigration status under federal legislation first proposed in 2001. <i>A rebellious young dreamer.</i>
entrepreneur	Someone who organizes a business venture and assumes the risk for it. <i>The music entrepreneur pulled back from financing a screenplay Hopper had written.</i>
<u>firebrand</u>	A piece of wood that has been burned or is burning. <i>A political firebrand.</i>
firmament	The heavens or sky. <i>Thunder shakes the firmament.</i>
heaven	The sky, especially perceived as a vault in which the sun, moon, stars, and planets are situated. <i>Good heavens.</i>
idealistic	Of high moral or intellectual value; elevated in nature or style- Oliver Franks. <i>Idealistic young doctors who went to work for the rebels.</i>
<u>imaginary</u>	Existing only in the imagination. <i>A small child s imaginary friends.</i>
libertarian	An advocate of libertarianism. <i>He holds libertarian views on most social issues.</i>
materialistic	Conforming to the standards and conventions of the middle class. <i>We re living in a highly materialistic society.</i>
nationalize	Make national in character or scope. <i>Mitterand nationalized the banks.</i>
nihilist	An advocate of anarchism. <i>It is impossible to argue against a nihilist.</i>
<u>paradise</u>	The abode of Adam and Eve before the Fall in the biblical account of the Creation; the Garden of Eden. <i>Martyrs who die in battle with the ungodly earn instant transmission to paradise.</i>

privatize	Transfer (a business, industry, or service) from public to private ownership and control. <i>The oil industry was privatized.</i>
<u>proletariat</u>	The lowest class of citizens in ancient Rome. <i>The growth of the industrial proletariat.</i>
<u>revolutionary</u>	Markedly new or introducing radical change. <i>The revolutionary army.</i>
sacred	Regarded as too valuable to be interfered with; sacrosanct. <i>Saw motherhood as woman s sacred calling.</i>
socialist	Advocating or following the socialist principles. <i>She was a lifelong socialist.</i>
<u>sublime</u>	Cause a substance to sublime. <i>The ice sublimed away leaving the books dry and undamaged.</i>
<u>subversive</u>	A subversive person. <i>The government claimed we were subversives or terrorists.</i>
supernal	Of heaven or the spirit. <i>Supernal erudition.</i>
welkin	The apparent surface of the imaginary sphere on which celestial bodies appear to be projected.
