Definitions of "Uttered" as an adjective

According to the Oxford Dictionary of English, "uttered" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- Without qualification; used informally as (often pejorative) intensifiers.
- Complete.
- Communicated in words.

complete Complete or carry out.

eloquently In an articulate manner.

Commentators have spoken **eloquently** on both sides of the issue.

Express or state clearly.

enunciate

She enunciated each word slowly.

incantation A series of words said as a magic spell or charm.

An **incantation** to raise the dead.

infertile Incapable of reproducing.

An **infertile** couple.

intently With earnest and eager attention.

He gazed at her **intently**.

irrevocably In an irrevocable manner.

Our environment will be **irrevocably** damaged.

knavery Lack of honesty; acts of lying or cheating or stealing.

A litany contained in the Book of Common Prayer.

The patient recited a **litany** of complaints.

A long utterance by one person (especially one that prevents others from

perfectly

In a manner or way that could not be better.

Perfectly clean glass bottles.

pronounce Speak pronounce or utter in a certain way.

Allow history to **pronounce** the verdict.
