## Uttered as an Adjective

### Definitions of "Uttered" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “uttered” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Without qualification; used informally as (often pejorative) intensifiers.*
- *Complete.*
- *Communicated in words.*

### Synonyms of "Uttered" as an adjective (3 Words)

**expressed** Precisely and clearly expressed or readily observable leaving nothing to implication.

**verbalised** Communicated in words.

**verbalized** Communicated in words.

## Associations of "Uttered" (30 Words)

<a href="#">absolute</a>	(of a ruler) having unrestricted power. <i><b>Absolute</b> loyalty.</i>
<b>aloud</b>	With relatively high volume. <i>He wept <b>aloud</b>.</i>
<b>arrant</b>	Without qualification; used informally as (often pejorative) intensifiers. <i>What <b>arrant</b> nonsense.</i>
<b>articulate</b>	Express (an idea or feeling) fluently and coherently. <i>Delicate <b>articulate</b> plants with a slender central stem.</i>
<b>complete</b>	Complete or carry out. <i>Quarry tiles and faded rugs <b>complete</b> the look.</i>
<b>eloquently</b>	In an articulate manner. <i>Commentators have spoken <b>eloquently</b> on both sides of the issue.</i>
<b>enunciate</b>	Express or state clearly. <i>She <b>enunciated</b> each word slowly.</i>
<b>incantation</b>	A series of words said as a magic spell or charm. <i>An <b>incantation</b> to raise the dead.</i>
<b>infertile</b>	Incapable of reproducing. <i>An <b>infertile</b> couple.</i>
<a href="#">intently</a>	With earnest and eager attention. <i>He gazed at her <b>intently</b>.</i>
<a href="#">irrevocably</a>	In an irrevocable manner. <i>Our environment will be <b>irrevocably</b> damaged.</i>
<b>knavery</b>	Lack of honesty; acts of lying or cheating or stealing.
<b>litany</b>	A litany contained in the Book of Common Prayer. <i>The patient recited a <b>litany</b> of complaints.</i>
<b>monologue</b>	A long utterance by one person (especially one that prevents others from participating in the conversation). <i>Fred carried on with his <b>monologue</b> as if I hadn't spoken.</i>
<b>perfectly</b>	In a manner or way that could not be better. <i><b>Perfectly</b> clean glass bottles.</i>
<b>pronounce</b>	Speak pronounce or utter in a certain way. <i>Allow history to <b>pronounce</b> the verdict.</i>
<a href="#">recite</a>	Recite in elocution. <i><b>Recite</b> a poem.</i>

<b><u>recount</u></b>	Count again. <i>I <b>recounted</b> the tale to Steve.</i>
<b><u>soliloquy</u></b>	A part of a play involving a soliloquy. <i>In the opening <b>soliloquy</b> he declares his true intent.</i>
<b><u>spell</u></b>	Orally recite the letters of or give the spelling of. <i>Journals have a house style about how to <b>spell</b>.</i>
<b><u>staring</u></b>	Without qualification; used informally as (often pejorative) intensifiers. <i><b>Staring</b> eyes.</i>
<b><u>stark</u></b>	Devoid of any qualifications or disguise or adornment. <i><b>Stark</b> staring mad.</i>
<b>tell</b>	Count (the members of a group). <i><b>Tell</b> me what is bothering you.</i>
<b><u>thoroughgoing</u></b>	Exemplifying a specified characteristic fully; absolute. <i>A <b>thoroughgoing</b> chocoholic.</i>
<b><u>totally</u></b>	Completely; absolutely. <i>So then Julie like <b>totally</b> dumps her boyfriend Tommy.</i>
<b><u>unadulterated</u></b>	Not mixed with impurities. <i><b>Unadulterated</b> whole milk yogurt.</i>
<b><u>unconditional</u></b>	Not conditional. <i><b>Unconditional</b> surrender.</i>
<b><u>unmitigated</u></b>	Absolute; unqualified. <i>An <b>unmitigated</b> horror.</i>
<b><u>verbalize</u></b>	Articulate; either verbally or with a cry, shout, or noise. <i>Many English nouns have become <b>verbalized</b>.</i>
<b>vocalize</b>	Write (a language such as Hebrew) with vowel points. <i>The child <b>vocalizes</b> a number of distinct sounds.</i>
