abandoned	Forsaken by owner or inhabitants. Weed grown yard of an abandoned farmhouse.
abolish	Do away with. Slavery was abolish ed in the mid 19th century in America and in Russia.
abrogate	Revoke formally. A proposal to abrogate temporarily the right to strike.
abrogation	The act of abrogating; an official or legal cancellation.
annul	Declare (a marriage) to have had no legal existence. <i>The contract was annulled</i> .
annulment	A formal termination (of a relationship or a judicial proceeding etc. The applicant sought the annulment of the decision.
<u>cancel</u>	A notation cancelling a previous sharp or flat. The electric fields may cancel each other out.
countermand	An order revoking a previous one. An order to arrest the strike leaders had been countermand ed.
<u>delete</u>	Cut or eliminate. Please delete my name from your list.
<u>deserted</u>	Forsaken by owner or inhabitants. Deserted beaches of soft sand.
<u>destitute</u>	Not having. The charity cares for destitute children.
drain	Empty of liquid drain the liquid from. Polly felt the blood drain from her face.
<u>emptiness</u>	An empty area or space. He realizes the emptiness of his statement.
<u>empty</u>	A bottle or glass left empty of its contents. An empty room.



<u>invalidate</u>	Deprive (an official document or procedure) of legal validity because it contravenes a regulation or law. A technical flaw in her papers invalidate d her nomination.
<u>island</u>	A zone or area resembling an island. This island nation.
nil	A quantity of no importance. They beat us three nil .
<u>null</u>	Combine a signal with another in order to create a null cancel out. The establishment of a new interim government was declared null and void.
<u>override</u>	Prevail over. The House vote in favour of the bill was 10 votes short of the requisite majority for an override .
repeal	The action of revoking or annulling a law or act of parliament. The legislation was repeal ed five months later.
rescind	Cancel officially. The government eventually rescind ed the directive.
reverse	The gears by which the motion of a machine can be reversed. Their press ads had a headline reverse d out of the illustration.
reversible	(of a reaction) occurring together with its converse, and so yielding an equilibrium mixture of reactants and products. <i>A reversible</i> pushchair seat.
revocable	Capable of being revoked or cancelled. A revocable order.
<u>revoke</u>	Cancel officially. The men appealed and the sentence was revoke d.
unoccupied	(of a building, seat, etc.) not being occupied or used. Unoccupied areas of France.
vacancy	Empty space. <i>Vacancy</i> vanity and inane deception.
<u>vacant</u>	Without an occupant or incumbent. 40 per cent of the offices are still vacant .
vacuum	Clean with a vacuum cleaner. Without their support he ll be ruling in a vacuum .
vain	Having or showing an excessively high opinion of one's appearance, abilities, or worth. A vain attempt to tidy up the room.
