Associations of "Vacated" (30 Words)

abandoned	Forsaken by owner or inhabitants. <i>Weed grown yard of an abandoned farmhouse.</i>
abolish	Do away with. <i>Slavery was abolished in the mid 19th century in America and in Russia.</i>
abrogate	Revoke formally. <i>A proposal to abrogate temporarily the right to strike.</i>
abrogation	The act of abrogating; an official or legal cancellation.
annul	Declare (a marriage) to have had no legal existence. <i>The contract was annulled.</i>
annulment	A formal termination (of a relationship or a judicial proceeding etc). <i>The applicant sought the annulment of the decision.</i>
cancel	A notation cancelling a previous sharp or flat. <i>The electric fields may cancel each other out.</i>
countermand	An order revoking a previous one. <i>An order to arrest the strike leaders had been countermanded.</i>
delete	Cut or eliminate. <i>Please delete my name from your list.</i>
deserted	Forsaken by owner or inhabitants. <i>Deserted beaches of soft sand.</i>
destitute	Not having. <i>The charity cares for destitute children.</i>
drain	Empty of liquid drain the liquid from. <i>Polly felt the blood drain from her face.</i>
emptiness	An empty area or space. <i>He realizes the emptiness of his statement.</i>
empty	A bottle or glass left empty of its contents. <i>An empty room.</i>

<u>invalidate</u>	Deprive (an official document or procedure) of legal validity because it contravenes a regulation or law. <i>A technical flaw in her papers invalidated her nomination.</i>
<u>island</u>	A zone or area resembling an island. <i>This island nation.</i>
nil	A quantity of no importance. <i>They beat us three nil.</i>
<u>null</u>	Combine a signal with another in order to create a null cancel out. <i>The establishment of a new interim government was declared null and void.</i>
<u>override</u>	Prevail over. <i>The House vote in favour of the bill was 10 votes short of the requisite majority for an override.</i>
repeal	The action of revoking or annulling a law or act of parliament. <i>The legislation was repealed five months later.</i>
rescind	Cancel officially. <i>The government eventually rescinded the directive.</i>
reverse	The gears by which the motion of a machine can be reversed. <i>Their press ads had a headline reversed out of the illustration.</i>
reversible	(of a reaction) occurring together with its converse, and so yielding an equilibrium mixture of reactants and products. <i>A reversible pushchair seat.</i>
revocable	Capable of being revoked or cancelled. <i>A revocable order.</i>
<u>revoke</u>	Cancel officially. <i>The men appealed and the sentence was revoked.</i>
unoccupied	(of a building, seat, etc.) not being occupied or used. <i>Unoccupied areas of France.</i>
vacancy	Empty space. <i>Vacancy vanity and inane deception.</i>
<u>vacant</u>	Without an occupant or incumbent. <i>40 per cent of the offices are still vacant.</i>
vacuum	Clean with a vacuum cleaner. <i>Without their support he ll be ruling in a vacuum.</i>
vain	Having or showing an excessively high opinion of one's appearance, abilities, or worth. <i>A vain attempt to tidy up the room.</i>
