
## Vale as a Noun

- A valley (used in place names or as a poetic term.








### Synonyms of "Vale" as a noun (1 Word)

# Associations of "Vale" (30 Words)

arroyo	A steep-sided gully formed by the action of fast-flowing water in an arid or semi- arid region, found chiefly in the south-western US.
beck	A beckoning gesture.
brae	A slope or hillside. A figure was spied struggling up the <b>brae</b> .
<u>brook</u>	Put up with something or somebody unpleasant. The Lake District boasts lovely lakes and babbling <b>brook</b> s.
<u>canyon</u>	A ravine formed by a river in an area with little rainfall. <i>The Grand Canyon</i> .
<u>cascade</u>	Rush down in big quantities like a cascade. A sudden <b>cascade</b> of sparks.
<u>chasm</u>	A deep opening in the earth's surface. The <b>chasm</b> between rich and poor.



<u>clay</u>	A hardened clay surface for a tennis court. <i>This lifeless <b>clay</b>.</i>
<u>cliff</u>	A steep high face of rock. <i>He stood on a high <b>cliff</b> overlooking the town.</i>
creek	A narrow, sheltered waterway, especially an inlet in a shoreline or channel in a marsh. A sandy beach in a sheltered <b>creek</b> .
foothill	A low hill at the base of a mountain or mountain range. The camp lies in the <b>foothill</b> s of the Andes.
ford	A shallow area in a stream that can be forded.
glen	A narrow valley, especially in Scotland or Ireland.
gorge	Eat a large amount greedily; fill oneself with food. They <b>gorge</b> d themselves on Cornish cream teas.
<u>gradient</u>	An inclined part of a road or railway; a slope. Fail safe brakes for use on steep <b>gradient</b> s.
<u>hill</u>	Form into a hill. They were climbing a steep <b>hill</b> in low gear.
incised	Cut into with a sharp instrument. An <b>incised</b> design.
lamprey	Primitive eellike freshwater or anadromous cyclostome having round sucking mouth with a rasping tongue.
<u>marsh</u>	New Zealand writer of detective stories (1899-1982. <i>Marsh</i> plants.
mound	A collection of objects laid on top of each other. A <b>mound</b> of dirty crockery.
<u>precipice</u>	A very steep cliff. We swerved toward the edge of the <b>precipice</b> .
ravine	A deep narrow steep-sided valley (especially one formed by running water.
<u>rift</u>	A major fault separating blocks of the earth s surface a rift valley. The <b>rift</b> between the two branches of the legal profession.
<u>river</u>	Used in names of animals and plants living in or associated with rivers e g river dolphin. <i>River</i> pollution.
<u>steep</u>	A steep mountain slope. <b>Steep</b> the blossoms in oil.
<u>stream</u>	Something that resembles a flowing stream in moving continuously. <i>The raft floated down<b>stream</b> on the current.</i>
