audacious	Disposed to venture or take risks. <i>An audacious interpretation of two Jacobean dramas.</i>
bold	Very steep; having a prominent and almost vertical front. <i>She tossed him a bold look.</i>
brave	Ready to face and endure danger or pain; showing courage. <i>Familiarity with danger makes a brave man braver but less daring.</i>
confident	Not liable to error in judgment or action- Walter Lippman- Michiko Kakutani. <i>Was confident he would win.</i>
courageous	Possessing or displaying courage; able to face and deal with danger or fear without flinching. <i>Her courageous human rights work.</i>
daring	Disposed to venture or take risks. <i>He rapidly discovered an audience hungry for his daring new works.</i>
dauntless	Invulnerable to fear or intimidation. <i>Dauntless bravery.</i>
doughty	Brave and persistent. <i>His doughty spirit kept him going.</i>
fearless	Showing a lack of fear. <i>Fearless reporters and photographers.</i>
gallant	(of a man) charmingly attentive and chivalrous to women. <i>A gallant gentleman came over and kissed my hand.</i>
heroic	Very imposing or impressive; surpassing the ordinary (especially in size or scale). <i>Of heroic proportions.</i>
intrepid	Fearless; adventurous (often used for rhetorical or humorous effect). <i>Our intrepid reporter.</i>
lionhearted	Brave and determined. <i>A brilliant lionhearted second half comeback.</i>
manful	Possessing qualities befitting a man. <i>A manful attempt to smile.</i>
manly	(of an activity) befitting a man. <i>Honest manly sports.</i>
mettlesome	Willing to face danger. <i>Their horses were beasts of burden not mettlesome chargers.</i>

- plucky** Having or showing determined courage in the face of difficulties.
*The **plucky** youngster has astounded medical staff.*
- spirited** Made lively or spirited.
*A warm hearted generous **spirited** man.*
- stout** (of a person) rather fat or of heavy build.
***Stout** hearts.*
- unabashed** Not embarrassed- Jerome Stone.
*A tinselled charm and **unabashed** sentimentality.*
- unalarmed** Not fitted with an alarm.
*An **unalarmed** fire exit door.*
- undaunted** Not intimidated or discouraged by difficulty, danger, or disappointment.
*They were **undaunted** by the huge amount of work needed.*
- undismayed** Not dismayed or discouraged by a setback.
***Undismayed** my mother sent me to a first class crammer for two terms.*
- unflinching** Not shrinking from danger.
*He has shown **unflinching** determination throughout the campaign.*
- unshrinking** Not shrinking from danger.
- valorous** Having or showing valor.
***Valorous** deeds on the field of honour.*

*I grabbed a couple of **boldly** patterned fabric samples.*

boldness	The trait of being willing to undertake things that involve risk or danger. <i>You will overlook my boldness I hope.</i>
brave	People who are brave. <i>His medals made a brave show.</i>
bravery	Feeling no fear. <i>Perhaps I ll get a medal for bravery.</i>
coolness	The quality or condition of being at a fairly low temperature. <i>Her art has an icy coolness.</i>
courage	A quality of spirit that enables you to face danger or pain without showing fear. <i>She called on all her courage to face the ordeal.</i>
courageous	Possessing or displaying courage; able to face and deal with danger or fear without flinching. <i>A frank courageous heart triumphed over pain.</i>
daring	(of a person or action) adventurous or audaciously bold. <i>A daring crime.</i>
daringly	In an adventurous manner.
fortitude	Courage in pain or adversity. <i>She endured her illness with great fortitude.</i>
gallant	Grand or impressive. <i>A gallant gentleman came over and kissed my hand.</i>
gallantry	Polite attentiveness to women. <i>No young man offers to carry this burden for her such gallantry is out of fashion.</i>
gutsy	Greedy. <i>The gutsy intensity of her musical involvement.</i>
hardy	United States slapstick comedian who played the pompous and overbearing member of the Laurel and Hardy duo who made many films (1892-1957). <i>A favourite flowering shrub for early spring vigorous and hardy.</i>
heroic	A verse form suited to the treatment of heroic or elevated themes dactylic hexameter or iambic pentameter. <i>Heroic undertakings.</i>
intrepid	Invulnerable to fear or intimidation. <i>Intrepid pioneers.</i>
manliness	The traditional male quality of being brave and strong. <i>Men accustomed to proving their manliness on the streets.</i>

manly	(of an activity) befitting a man. <i>A manly torso of perfect proportions.</i>
masculine	A masculine word or form. <i>A masculine cadence.</i>
plucky	Showing courage. <i>The plucky youngster has astounded medical staff.</i>
robust	Strong enough to withstand or overcome intellectual challenges or adversity. <i>A robust body.</i>
shameless	(of a person or their conduct) characterized by or showing a lack of shame; barefaced or brazen. <i>A shameless imposter.</i>
stalwart	Having rugged physical strength; inured to fatigue or hardships. <i>A stalwart knight.</i>
unflinching	Not shrinking from danger. <i>He has shown unflinching determination throughout the campaign.</i>
valor	The qualities of a hero or heroine; exceptional or heroic courage when facing danger (especially in battle). <i>He received a medal for valor.</i>
valorous	Having or showing valor. <i>Valorous deeds on the field of honour.</i>
venturous	Disposed to venture or take risks. <i>A venturous spirit.</i>
virility	The masculine property of being capable of copulation and procreation. <i>Great importance is placed on a man's virility.</i>
