Definitions of "Vandalize" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “vandalize” as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Deliberately destroy or damage (public or private property).*
- *Destroy wantonly, as through acts of vandalism.*



Synonyms of "Vandalize" as a verb (15 Words)

blemish

Add a flaw or blemish to make imperfect or defective.
*Her face was **blemished**.*

blight

Infect plants with blight.
*Some people complain that wind farms **blight** the landscape.*

deface

Mar or spoil the appearance of.
*Scars **defaced** her cheeks.*

defile

Damage the purity or appearance of; mar or spoil.
*The townspeople **defiled** the river by emptying raw sewage into it.*

desecrate

Treat (a sacred place or thing) with violent disrespect.
*Many lanes are **desecrated** with yellow lines.*

disfigure

Mar or spoil the appearance of.
*Litter **disfigures** the countryside.*

do damage to Carry out or perform an action.

| <u>harm</u> | Cause or do harm to. <i>These pills won't harm your system.</i> |
| <u>impair</u> | Make worse or less effective. <i>A noisy job could permanently impair their hearing.</i> |
| injure | Suffer physical harm or damage to (a part of one's body). <i>A libel calculated to injure the company's reputation.</i> |
| mangle | Press with a mangle. <i>Mangle the sheets.</i> |
| mar | Make imperfect. <i>Violence marred a number of New Year celebrations.</i> |
| mutilate | Inflict serious damage on. <i>Most of the prisoners had been mutilated.</i> |
| spoil | (of food) become unfit for eating. <i>The enemy entered into Hereford spoiled and fired the city and razed the walls to the ground.</i> |
| vandalise | Destroy wantonly, as through acts of vandalism. |



Usage Examples of "Vandalize" as a verb

- *Vandalize the park.*
- *Stations have been vandalized beyond recognition.*
