- *The fruit of the vanilla plant which is cured and then either used in cooking or processed to extract an essence which is used for flavour and fragrance.*
- *A flavoring prepared from vanilla beans macerated in alcohol (or imitating vanilla beans).*
- *A substance obtained from vanilla pods or produced artificially and used to flavour foods or to impart a fragrant scent to cosmetic preparations.*

cake	An item of savoury food formed into a flat round shape, and typically baked or fried. <i>The blood under his nose was beginning to cake.</i>
cantaloupe	The fruit of a cantaloupe vine; small to medium-sized melon with yellowish flesh.
chocolate	Hot chocolate. <i>His chocolate brown eyes.</i>
cinnamon	Tropical Asian tree with aromatic yellowish brown bark source of the spice cinnamon. <i>A teaspoon of ground cinnamon.</i>
cocoa	A hot drink made from cocoa powder mixed with milk or water.
coconut	The flesh of a coconut often used as food. <i>Coconut shells.</i>
confection	Make into a confection. <i>A fruit confection.</i>
creamy	Thick like cream. <i>Creamy white flowers.</i>
crystallized	Made clear or definite. <i>She didn't have any crystallized plans for her career path after graduation.</i>
flavour	A substance used to alter or enhance the taste of food or drink a flavouring. <i>Whitewashed walls and red roof tiles gave the resort a Mediterranean flavour.</i>
frothy	Light and entertaining but of little substance. <i>Foamy or frothy beer.</i>
honey	Of something having the color of honey. <i>Her honey skin.</i>
molasses	Thick dark syrup produced by boiling down juice from sugar cane; especially during sugar refining.
pepper	Sprinkle or season food with pepper. <i>The script is peppered with four letter words.</i>
pineapple	The widely cultivated tropical American plant that bears the pineapple It is low growing with a spiral of spiny sword shaped leaves on a thick stem. <i>Roughly chop the pineapples and apricots.</i>
plum	The deciduous tree which bears plums. <i>The helicopter crashed plum on the cabins.</i>
powder	Sprinkle or cover a surface with powder or a powdery substance. <i>She applied lipstick and powder.</i>

prune	An unpleasant or disagreeable person. <i>He was a good leader but a right miserable old prune.</i>
pudding	A fat or stupid person. <i>Corn pudding.</i>
raisin	Dried grape.
salt	Sprinkle as if with salt. <i>People used to salt meats on ships.</i>
seedpod	A several-seeded dehiscent fruit as e.g. of a leguminous plant.
spice	Flavour with spice. <i>She was probably adding details to spice up the story.</i>
sugar	A lump or teaspoonful of sugar used to sweeten tea or coffee. <i>I ll have mine black with two sugars.</i>
sweet	With sweetening added. <i>A sweet little cat.</i>
vinegar	Sour-tasting liquid produced usually by oxidation of the alcohol in wine or cider and used as a condiment or food preservative. <i>Her aggrieved tone held a touch of vinegar.</i>
