## Vanish as a Verb

### Definitions of "Vanish" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “vanish” as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Become invisible or unnoticeable.*
- *Become zero.*
- *Pass away rapidly.*
- *Decrease rapidly and disappear.*
- *Cease to exist.*
- *Get lost, as without warning or explanation.*
- *Disappear suddenly and completely.*
- *Gradually cease to exist.*



## Synonyms of "Vanish" as a verb (31 Words)

<b>be invisible</b>	Have life, be alive.
<b>be lost to sight</b>	Represent, as of a character on stage.
<b>be lost to view</b>	Be identical to; be someone or something.
<b>be no more</b>	To remain unmolested, undisturbed, or uninterrupted — used only in infinitive form.
<b>become extinct</b>	Enter or assume a certain state or condition.
<b>become invisible</b>	Enhance the appearance of.
<b>become obsolete</b>	Undergo a change or development.
<b>cease to be</b>	Put an end to a state or an activity.
<b>cease to exist</b>	Have an end, in a temporal, spatial, or quantitative sense; either spatial or metaphorical.
<b>come to an end</b>	Have a certain priority.

<b>depart</b>	Leave (one's job). <i>The train <b>departs</b> at noon.</i>
<b>die out</b>	Languish as with love or desire. Become invisible or unnoticeable.
<b>disappear</b>	<i>It is estimated that some 7000 people have been <b>disappeared</b> by security forces.</i>
<b>disperse</b>	Move away from each other. <i>Caravan sites could be <b>dispersed</b> among trees so as to be out of sight.</i>
<b>dissipate</b>	To cause to separate and go in different directions. <i>The cloud of smoke <b>dissipated</b>.</i>
<b>end</b>	Have an end in a temporal spatial or quantitative sense either spatial or metaphorical. <i>When the war <b>ended</b> policy changed.</i>
<b>evanesce</b>	Disappear gradually. <i>Water moves among reeds <b>evanesces</b> shines.</i>
<b>evaporate</b>	Cause to change into a vapor. <i><b>Evaporate</b> milk.</i>
<b>fade</b>	(of a racehorse, runner, etc.) lose strength and cease to perform well. <i>She <b>faded</b> near the finish.</i>
<b>fade away</b>	Lose freshness, vigor, or vitality.
<b>fell</b>	Cause to fall by or as if by delivering a blow.
<b>fly</b>	Hit a fly. <i>Man cannot <b>fly</b>.</i>
<b>go away</b>	Stop operating or functioning.
<b>leave</b>	Leave behind unintentionally. <i>This <b>leaves</b> no room for improvement.</i>
<b>melt away</b>	Become less clearly visible or distinguishable; disappear gradually or seemingly.
<b>pass</b>	Pass over across or through. <i>The Portuguese trade <b>passed</b> its peak in the 1760s.</i>
<b>pass away</b>	Transfer to another; of rights or property.
<b>recede from view</b>	Retreat.
<b>vanish into thin air</b>	Become invisible or unnoticeable.
<b>vaporize</b>	Convert or be converted into vapour. <i>There is a large current which is sufficient to <b>vaporize</b> carbon.</i>

**withdraw**

Withdraw from active participation.  
*Both countries agreed to **withdraw** their troops.*



**Usage Examples of "Vanish" as a verb**

- *The money vanished in las Vegas.*
- *The effect vanished when day broke.*
- *An entire civilization vanished.*
- *The environment is under threat—hedgerows and woodlands are vanishing.*
- *Moira vanished without trace.*



## Associations of "Vanish" (30 Words)

- ablate** Gradually remove material from or erode (a surface or object) by melting, evaporation, frictional action, etc., or erode (material) in this way.  
*Therapeutic intervention to **ablate** existing cancer cells.*
- apoplectic** Relating to or denoting apoplexy (stroke).  
*An **apoplectic** attack.*
- [decease](#) Pass from physical life and lose all bodily attributes and functions necessary to sustain life.  
*He **deceased** at his palace of Croydon.*
- desiccant** A hygroscopic substance used as a drying agent.  
*A small packet of **desiccant** to absorb any moisture.*
- desiccation** The removal of moisture from something.  
*Stems were stored in plastic bags to prevent **desiccation**.*

<b>die</b>	Die one after another until few or none are left. <i>The original founders <b>died</b> off or retired.</i>
<b><u>disappear</u></b>	Get lost, as without warning or explanation. <i>The sun had <b>disappeared</b>.</i>
<b><u>disappearance</u></b>	The act of leaving secretly or without explanation. <i>He regretted the <b>disappearance</b> of Greek from school curricula.</i>
<b>dissipate</b>	Spend frivolously and unwisely. <i>The concern she d felt for him had wholly <b>dissipated</b>.</i>
<b>dryness</b>	The condition of not containing or being covered by a liquid (especially water). <i>There s a lovely <b>dryness</b> to this straw coloured wine.</i>
<b>evaporate</b>	(of something abstract) cease to exist. <i>The water <b>evaporated</b> in front of our eyes.</i>
<b>evaporation</b>	The process of turning from liquid into vapour. <i>Snow cover prevents <b>evaporation</b> of water from the soil.</i>
<b><u>extinct</u></b>	Permanently inactive. <i>The sort of girls school that is now <b>extinct</b>.</i>
<b><u>fade</u></b>	A golf shot that curves to the right for a right-handed golfer. <i>The light had <b>faded</b> and dusk was advancing.</i>
<b><u>forget</u></b>	Forget to do something. <i>Don t <b>forget</b> to call the chairman of the board to the meeting.</i>
<b><u>gone</u></b>	Having reached a specified time in a pregnancy. <i>Bygone days.</i>
<b>hide</b>	A camouflaged shelter used to observe wildlife at close quarters. <i>He used to <b>hide</b> out in a cave.</i>
<b><u>inconspicuous</u></b>	Not prominent or readily noticeable. <i>An <b>inconspicuous</b> red brick building.</i>
<b><u>invisible</u></b>	Invisible exports and imports. <i>This <b>invisible</b> gas is present to some extent in every home.</i>
<b>lapse</b>	(of a right, privilege, or agreement) become invalid because it is not used, claimed, or renewed; expire. <i>The country has <b>lapsed</b> into chaos.</i>
<b>leave</b>	Leave unchanged or undisturbed or refrain from taking. <i><b>Leave</b> the room.</i>
<b><u>miss</u></b>	Be too late to catch (a passenger vehicle or the post). <i>She <b>misses</b> all her old friends.</i>

<b>neglect</b>	The trait of neglecting responsibilities and lacking concern. <i>He was reported for <b>neglect</b> of duty.</i>
<b>obscurity</b>	The state of being indistinct or indefinite for lack of adequate illumination. <i>He worked in <b>obscurity</b> for many years.</i>
<b>perish</b>	(of rubber, food, etc.) lose its normal qualities; rot or decay. <i>An abandoned tyre whose rubber had <b>perished</b>.</i>
<b>transpiration</b>	The emission of water vapor from the leaves of plants. <i>Plants lose more than 90 per cent of their water through <b>transpiration</b>.</i>
<b>undeserved</b>	Not warranted, merited, or earned. <i>Has an <b>undeserved</b> reputation as a coward.</i>
<b>unseen</b>	An unseen passage for translation. <i>It seemed she might escape <b>unseen</b>.</i>
<b>vaporize</b>	Decrease rapidly and disappear. <i>All my stock assets have <b>vaporized</b>.</i>
<b>withdraw</b>	Withdraw from active participation. <i>Both countries agreed to <b>withdraw</b> their troops.</i>
