- *Widely different.*

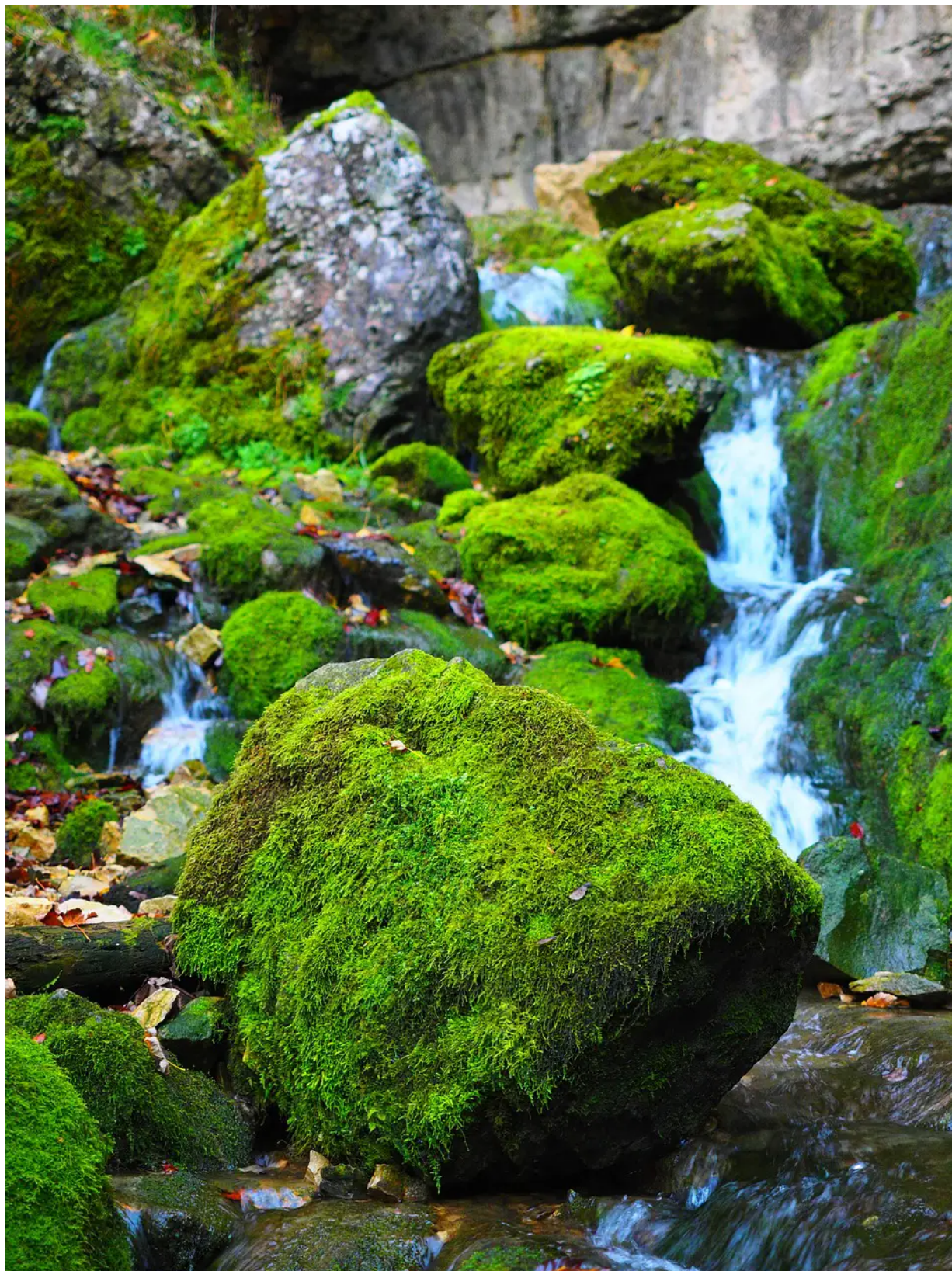


## Synonyms of "Varied" as an adjective (16 Words)

<u><a href="#">assorted</a></u>	Of many different kinds purposefully arranged but lacking any uniformity. <b>Assorted</b> sizes.
<u><a href="#">differing</a></u>	Not the same as each other; dissimilar. Widely <b>differing</b> circumstances.
<u><a href="#">disparate</a></u>	Including markedly dissimilar elements. <b>Disparate</b> ideas.
<b>diverse</b>	Distinctly dissimilar or unlike. Subjects as <b>diverse</b> as architecture language teaching and the physical sciences.
<u><a href="#">diversified</a></u>	Having variety of character or form or components; or having increased variety. <b>Diversified</b> farming.
<u><a href="#">haphazard</a></u>	Lacking any obvious principle of organization. The music business works in a <b>haphazard</b> fashion.

<b>heterogeneous</b>	Consisting of elements that are not of the same kind or nature. <i>The population of the United States is vast and <b>heterogeneous</b>.</i>
<b>jumbled</b>	In utter disorder.
<b>manifold</b>	Many and various. <i>The implications of this decision were <b>manifold</b>.</i>
<b>miscellaneous</b>	(of a collection or group) composed of members or elements of different kinds. <i>A <b>miscellaneous</b> crowd.</i>
<b>mixed</b>	Composed of different varieties of the same thing. <i>People of <b>mixed</b> race.</i>
<b>motley</b>	Having sections or patches colored differently and usually brightly. <i>A <b>motley</b> crew of discontents and zealots.</i>
<b>multifarious</b>	Having many varied parts or aspects. <i>The <b>multifarious</b> noise of a great city.</i>
<b>sundry</b>	Consisting of a haphazard assortment of different kinds. <i>Prawn and garlic vol au vents and <b>sundry</b> other delicacies.</i>
<b>variegated</b>	(of a plant or foliage) having or consisting of leaves that are edged or patterned in a second colour, especially white as well as green. <i>The <b>variegated</b> form of philadelphus.</i>
<b>wide-ranging</b>	Including much.

- *His work is interesting and varied.*
- *A long and varied career.*
- *Immigrants' varied ethnic and religious traditions.*
- *Her quickly varied answers indicated uncertainty.*

**assorted**

Of many different kinds purposefully arranged but lacking any uniformity.  
***Assorted*** sizes.

**changed**

Changed in constitution or structure or composition by metamorphism.  
***Changed*** styles of dress.

<b>different</b>	Differing from all others; not ordinary. <i>The car is <b>different</b> from anything else on the market.</i>
<b>dissimilar</b>	Marked by dissimilarity. <i>A collection of <b>dissimilar</b> nations lacking overall homogeneity.</i>
<b>distorted</b>	Giving a misleading or false account or impression; misrepresented. <i><b>Distorted</b> guitars.</i>
<b>diverse</b>	Showing a great deal of variety; very different. <i>Subjects as <b>diverse</b> as architecture language teaching and the physical sciences.</i>
<b>harebrained</b>	Very foolish. <i><b>Harebrained</b> ideas.</i>
<b>heterogeneous</b>	Consisting of elements that are not of the same kind or nature. <i>The population of the United States is vast and <b>heterogeneous</b>.</i>
<b>itemize</b>	Break down (a whole) into its constituent parts. <i>I have <b>itemized</b> the morning s tasks.</i>
<b>manifold</b>	A pipe or chamber branching into several openings. <i>The exhaust <b>manifold</b>.</i>
<b>metamorphic</b>	Of or marked by metamorphosis. <i>The supermodels <b>metamorphic</b> ability to bend their looks.</i>
<b>miscellaneous</b>	(of items or people gathered or considered together) of various types or from different sources. <i><b>Miscellaneous</b> accessories.</i>
<b>miscellany</b>	A book containing a collection of pieces of writing by different authors. <i>A <b>miscellany</b> of houses.</i>
<b>mixed</b>	(of an assessment of, reaction to, or feeling about something) containing a mixture of both favourable and negative elements. <i>A <b>mixed</b> neighborhood.</i>
<b>modified</b>	Changed in form or character. <i>Their <b>modified</b> stand made the issue more acceptable.</i>
<b>motley</b>	Make motley color with different colors. <i>A <b>motley</b> crew.</i>
<b>multifaceted</b>	Having many different aspects or features. <i>The diamond s <b>multifaceted</b> surface.</i>
<b>multifarious</b>	Having many varied parts or aspects. <i>A vast <b>multifarious</b> organization.</i>
<b>numerous</b>	Great in number; many. <i>The family was <b>numerous</b>.</i>

<b>pastiche</b>	Imitate the style of (an artist or work). <i>The songs amount to much more than blatant <b>pastiche</b>.</i>
<b>pluralism</b>	The practice of holding more than one ecclesiastical office at a time.
<b>potpourri</b>	A mixture of dried petals and spices placed in a bowl to perfume a room. <i>He played a <b>potpourri</b> of tunes from Gilbert and Sullivan.</i>
<b>protean</b>	Taking on different forms. <i>Eyes of that baffling <b>protean</b> grey which is never twice the same.</i>
<u><b>respective</b></u>	Considered individually. <i>They chatted about their <b>respective</b> childhoods.</i>
<u><b>several</b></u>	Distinct and individual. <i><b>Several</b> letters came in the mail.</i>
<b>sundry</b>	Of various kinds; several. <i><b>Sundry</b> sciences commonly known as social.</i>
<b>transformed</b>	Given a completely different form or appearance. <i>Shocked to see the <b>transformed</b> landscape.</i>
<b>variety</b>	A collection containing a variety of sorts of things. <i>He goes to France for <b>variety</b>.</i>
<u><b>various</b></u>	Distinctly dissimilar or unlike. <i>His <b>various</b> achievements are impressive.</i>
<u><b>versatile</b></u>	Able to adapt or be adapted to many different functions or activities. <i>A <b>versatile</b> anther of a flower moves freely in the wind.</i>
