- variable** (used of a device) designed so that a property (as e.g. light) can be varied.  
*The drill has **variable** speed.*
- varied** Characterized by variety.  
*A long and **varied** career.*

### **alter**

Make an alteration to.  
*This dress needs to be **altered**.*

### **another**

Any of various alternatives; some other.  
*Put it off to **another** or some other day.*

### **border**

A district near the border between two areas.  
*The unknown regions at the **borders** of physics and electronics.*

### **change**

Undergo a change become different in essence losing one s or its original nature.  
*There were marked **changes** in the lining of the lungs.*

### **changed**

Changed in constitution or structure or composition by metamorphism.  
*A greatly **changed** country after the war.*

### **compatibility**

The ability of one computer, piece of software, etc. to work with another.  
*He argues for the **compatibility** of science and religion.*

### **degree**

Social or official rank.  
*A second **degree** burn.*

<b>difference</b>	The state or condition of being dissimilar. <i>The insurance company will pay the <b>difference</b>.</i>
<b><u>disjointed</u></b>	Separated at the joint. <i>A <b>disjointed</b> fowl.</i>
<b><u>disparate</u></b>	Including markedly dissimilar elements. <i><b>Disparate</b> ideas.</i>
<b>dispersed</b>	Distributed or spread over a considerable extent. <i>Has ties with many widely <b>dispersed</b> friends.</i>
<b>distributed</b>	(of a computer system) spread over several machines, especially over a network. <i>The <b>distributed</b> supplies are meticulously monitored to make sure everyone gets their share.</i>
<b>each</b>	(used of count nouns) every one considered individually. <i><b>Each</b> person is mortal.</i>
<b><u>fluctuate</u></b>	Cause to fluctuate or move in a wavelike pattern. <i>The stock market <b>fluctuates</b>.</i>
<b>fluctuation</b>	A wave motion. <i>He kept a record of price <b>fluctuations</b>.</i>
<b><u>flux</u></b>	Treat a metal object with a flux to promote melting. <i>The newness and <b>flux</b> of the computer industry.</i>
<b>interscholastic</b>	Used of competition or cooperation between secondary schools.
<b>limit</b>	Set or serve as a limit to. <i>There are <b>limits</b> on the amount you can bet.</i>
<b><u>modification</u></b>	The grammatical relation that exists when a word qualifies the meaning of the phrase. <i>A <b>modification</b> of last year's model.</i>
<b>overestimate</b>	Make too high an estimate of. <i>He <b>overestimated</b> his own powers.</i>
<b>overrate</b>	Have a higher opinion of (someone or something) than is deserved. <i>It is easy to <b>overrate</b> what Frederick achieved.</i>
<b><u>parameter</u></b>	A limit or boundary which defines the scope of a particular process or activity. <i>The <b>parameters</b> within which the media work.</i>
<b><u>transform</u></b>	Subject to a mathematical transformation. <i>He wanted to <b>transform</b> himself into a successful businessman.</i>
<b>transformation</b>	A marked change in form, nature, or appearance. <i>British society underwent a radical <b>transformation</b>.</i>

- unlike** Marked by dissimilarity.  
*He was very **unlike** to any other man.*
- variance** The state or fact of disagreeing or quarrelling.  
*They were at **variance** with all their previous allies.*
- variant** Exhibiting variation and change.  
*Letters **variant** in size.*
- variation** A deviation of a celestial body from its mean orbit or motion.  
*The figures showed marked **variation** from year to year.*
- vary** Be at variance with; be out of line with.  
*Prices **vary**.*
- widely** To a large degree in nature or character (used to describe considerable variation or difference).  
*People in **widely** different circumstances.*
