- *A secure room in a bank in which valuables are stored.*
- *An arched brick or stone ceiling or roof.*
- *A chamber beneath a church or in a graveyard used for burials.*
- *A large room or chamber used for storage, especially an underground one.*
- *A roof in the form of an arch or a series of arches, typical of churches and other large, formal buildings.*
- *The act of jumping over an obstacle.*
- *A burial chamber (usually underground).*
- *A strongroom or compartment (often made of steel) for safekeeping of valuables.*
- *A thing resembling an arched roof, especially the sky.*
- *The arched roof of a cavity, especially that of the skull.*

An arch forming a monument or ornamental feature.
*The muscles in the **arch** of my right foot suddenly seized up.*

arched ceiling

A curved bony structure supporting or enclosing organs (especially the inner sides of the feet).

arched roof

A curved bony structure supporting or enclosing organs (especially the inner sides of the feet).

bank vault

Sloping land (especially the slope beside a body of water).

basement

The floor of a building which is partly or entirely below ground level.

A **basement** flat.

burial vault

The ritual placing of a corpse in a grave.

catacomb	An underground construction resembling or compared to catacombs.
<u>cavern</u>	A large, dark place or space. <i>A dark cavern of a shop.</i>
cellar	A room below ground level in a house, often used for storing wine or coal. <i>The servants led us down into a cellar.</i>
<u>crypt</u>	An underground room or vault beneath a church, used as a chapel or burial place.
depository	A facility where things can be deposited for storage or safekeeping. <i>Irish libraries became depositories for material from all over the world.</i>
dome	A sports stadium with a domed roof. <i>A content face topped by a shaved dome.</i>
<u>hurdle</u>	A horse race over a series of hurdles. <i>Many would like to emigrate to the United States but face formidable hurdles.</i>
repository	A central location in which data is stored and managed. <i>His mind was a rich repository of the past.</i>
safe	Strongbox where valuables can be safely kept.
safe deposit	A ventilated or refrigerated cupboard for securing provisions from pests.
safety deposit	A safe place.
strongroom	A room, typically one in a bank, designed to protect valuable items against fire and theft.
treasury	The British cabinet minister responsible for economic strategy. <i>Henry VII had kept the peace and filled his treasury.</i>
undercroft	The crypt of a church.
underground chamber	A secret group organized to overthrow a government or occupation force.

account	Keep an account of. <i>After 1292 he accounted to the Westminster exchequer.</i>
<u>amortize</u>	Reduce or pay off (a debt) with regular payments. <i>The vessel's owners could not amortize her high capital costs.</i>
appropriation	Incorporation by joining or uniting. <i>The necessary funds were obtained by the government's appropriation of the company's operating unit.</i>
<u>audit</u>	An inspection of the accounting procedures and records by a trained accountant or CPA. <i>A method of auditing obstetric and neonatal care.</i>
bank	Do business with a bank or keep an account at a bank. <i>The bank is on the corner of Nassau and Witherspoon.</i>

billing	The fact of being advertised or described in a particular way. <i>The account was worth about 2 million a year in billings.</i>
budgetary	Relating to or in accordance with an estimate of income and expenditure. <i>Tight budgetary constraints.</i>
cash	Exchange for cash. <i>A discount for cash.</i>
coffer	A strongbox or small chest for holding valuables. <i>A battered leather coffer sealed with a waxen crest.</i>
debt	The state of owing money. <i>I paid off my debts.</i>
expenditure	The action of spending funds. <i>Work is the expenditure of energy.</i>
financial	Involving financial matters. <i>At the end of the year fund managers sell their worst performing stocks and financials have fared badly this year.</i>
fund	Accumulate a fund for the discharge of a recurrent liability. <i>Fund a medical care plan.</i>
funding	The action or practice of providing funding. <i>Funding for the project was provided by the Housing Corporation.</i>
funds	Assets in the form of money.
installment	A part of a broadcast serial.
investment	Money that is invested with an expectation of profit. <i>A debate over private investment in road building.</i>
invoice	Send an invoice for goods or services provided. <i>She invoiced the company for her expenses.</i>
outlay	The act of spending or disbursing money. <i>A modest outlay on local advertising.</i>
overcharge	Charge someone (a sum) beyond the correct amount. <i>An overcharge of 40.</i>
paycheck	A check issued in payment of wages or salary.
price	Determine the price of. <i>The parable of the pearl of great price.</i>
rates	A local tax on property (usually used in the plural).
repayment	An amount of money paid back. <i>Minimum monthly repayments.</i>
revenue	The department of the civil service collecting state revenue. <i>The government s tax revenues.</i>

Search or seek.

*I must **search** the internet for one of his pictures.*

storage

The action or method of storing something for future use.

*Data **storage**.*

tax

Impose a tax on someone or something.

*Higher **taxes** will dampen consumer spending.*

usurious

Greatly exceeding bounds of reason or moderation.

*They lend money at **usurious** rates.*

vat

Place or treat in a vat.

*The grapes are **vatted** for between 15 and 21 days and then aged in small barrels.*
