### bank vault

Sloping land (especially the slope beside a body of water).

### basement

The floor of a building which is partly or entirely below ground level.

<b><u>cavern</u></b>	A large, dark place or space. <i>A dark <b>cavern</b> of a shop.</i>
<b>cellar</b>	A room below ground level in a house, often used for storing wine or coal. <i>The servants led us down into a <b>cellar</b>.</i>
<b><u>crypt</u></b>	An underground room or vault beneath a church, used as a chapel or burial place.
<b>depository</b>	A facility where things can be deposited for storage or safekeeping. <i>Irish libraries became depositories for material from all over the world.</i>
<b>dome</b>	A sports stadium with a domed roof. <i>A content face topped by a shaved <b>dome</b>.</i>
<b><u>hurdle</u></b>	A horse race over a series of hurdles. <i>Many would like to emigrate to the United States but face formidable <b>hurdles</b>.</i>
<b>repository</b>	A central location in which data is stored and managed. <i>His mind was a rich <b>repository</b> of the past.</i>
<b>safe</b>	Strongbox where valuables can be safely kept.
<b>safe deposit</b>	A ventilated or refrigerated cupboard for securing provisions from pests.
<b>safety deposit</b>	A safe place.
<b>strongroom</b>	A room, typically one in a bank, designed to protect valuable items against fire and theft.
<b>treasury</b>	The British cabinet minister responsible for economic strategy. <i>Henry VII had kept the peace and filled his <b>treasury</b>.</i>
<b>undercroft</b>	The crypt of a church.
<b>underground chamber</b>	A secret group organized to overthrow a government or occupation force.

- account** Keep an account of.  
*After 1292 he **accounted** to the Westminster exchequer.*
- amortize** Reduce or pay off (a debt) with regular payments.  
*The vessel's owners could not **amortize** her high capital costs.*
- appropriation** Incorporation by joining or uniting.  
*The necessary funds were obtained by the government's **appropriation** of the company's operating unit.*
- audit** An inspection of the accounting procedures and records by a trained accountant or CPA.  
*A method of **auditing** obstetric and neonatal care.*
- bank** Do business with a bank or keep an account at a bank.  
*The **bank** is on the corner of Nassau and Witherspoon.*

<b>billing</b>	The fact of being advertised or described in a particular way. <i>The account was worth about 2 million a year in <b>billings</b>.</i>
<b>budgetary</b>	Relating to or in accordance with an estimate of income and expenditure. <i>Tight <b>budgetary</b> constraints.</i>
<b>cash</b>	Exchange for cash. <i>A discount for <b>cash</b>.</i>
<b>coffer</b>	A strongbox or small chest for holding valuables. <i>A battered leather <b>coffer</b> sealed with a waxen crest.</i>
<b>debt</b>	The state of owing money. <i>I paid off my <b>debts</b>.</i>
<b>expenditure</b>	The action of spending funds. <i>Work is the <b>expenditure</b> of energy.</i>
<b>financial</b>	Involving financial matters. <i>At the end of the year fund managers sell their worst performing stocks and <b>financials</b> have fared badly this year.</i>
<b>fund</b>	Accumulate a fund for the discharge of a recurrent liability. <i><b>Fund</b> a medical care plan.</i>
<b>funding</b>	The action or practice of providing funding. <i><b>Funding</b> for the project was provided by the Housing Corporation.</i>
<b>funds</b>	Assets in the form of money.
<b>installment</b>	A part of a broadcast serial.
<b>investment</b>	Money that is invested with an expectation of profit. <i>A debate over private <b>investment</b> in road building.</i>
<b>invoice</b>	Send an invoice for goods or services provided. <i>She <b>invoiced</b> the company for her expenses.</i>
<b>outlay</b>	The act of spending or disbursing money. <i>A modest <b>outlay</b> on local advertising.</i>
<b>overcharge</b>	Charge someone (a sum) beyond the correct amount. <i>An <b>overcharge</b> of 40.</i>
<b>paycheck</b>	A check issued in payment of wages or salary.
<b>price</b>	Determine the price of. <i>The parable of the pearl of great <b>price</b>.</i>
<b>rates</b>	A local tax on property (usually used in the plural).
<b>repayment</b>	An amount of money paid back. <i>Minimum monthly <b>repayments</b>.</i>
<b>revenue</b>	The department of the civil service collecting state revenue. <i>The government s tax <b>revenues</b>.</i>
