## Vegetation as a Noun

### Definitions of "Vegetation" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “vegetation” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *An abnormal growth or excrescence (especially a warty excrescence on the valves of the heart).*
- *The process of growth in plants.*
- *Inactivity that is passive and monotonous, comparable to the inactivity of plant life.*
- *Plants considered collectively, especially those found in a particular area or habitat.*
- *All the plant life in a particular region or period.*
- *The action or process of vegetating.*



### Synonyms of "Vegetation" as a noun (4 Words)

- botany** The scientific study of the physiology, structure, genetics, ecology, distribution, classification, and economic importance of plants.  
*The **botany** of China.*
- flora** A living organism lacking the power of locomotion.  
*Britain's native **flora**.*
- plant life** Buildings for carrying on industrial labor.
- plants** An actor situated in the audience whose acting is rehearsed but seems spontaneous to the audience.  
*He claimed that the evidence against him was a **plant**.*

## Associations of "Vegetation" (30 Words)

<b>arboreal</b>	Of or relating to or formed by trees. <i><b>Arboreal</b> apes.</i>
<b>arboretum</b>	A facility where trees and shrubs are cultivated for exhibition.
<b>aster</b>	Any of various chiefly fall-blooming herbs of the genus Aster with showy daisylike flowers.
<b>azalea</b>	Any of numerous ornamental shrubs grown for their showy flowers of various colors.
<b>bog</b>	Be prevented from making progress in a task or activity. <i>A peat <b>bog</b>.</i>
<b>botanical</b>	Relating to botany. <i><b>Botanical</b> garden.</i>
<b>botany</b>	The plant life of a particular region, habitat, or geological period. <i>The <b>botany</b> of North America.</i>

<b>clover</b>	A herbaceous plant of the pea family, with dense globular flower heads and leaves which are typically three-lobed. It is an important fodder and rotational crop.
<b>conservatory</b>	A greenhouse in which plants are arranged in a pleasing manner. <i>Keep plant cuttings in a frost free <b>conservatory</b> or greenhouse.</i>
<b>daisy</b>	Used in names of other plants of the daisy family e g Michaelmas daisy Shasta daisy.
<b>dandelion</b>	A widely distributed weed of the daisy family, with a rosette of leaves and large bright yellow flowers followed by globular heads of seeds with downy tufts.
<b>efflorescence</b>	A powdery deposit on a surface. <i><b>Efflorescences</b> found on the sheltered undersides of shale ledges.</i>
<b>flora</b>	All the plant life in a particular region or period. <i>The <b>flora</b> of southern California.</i>
<b>flower</b>	The state or period in which a plant's flowers have developed and opened. <i>A bunch of <b>flowers</b>.</i>
<b>flowering</b>	Capable of producing flowers, especially in contrast to a similar plant with the flowers inconspicuous or absent. <i>Winter <b>flowering</b> heathers.</i>
<b><u>garden</u></b>	Cultivate or work in a garden. <i>My hobby is <b>gardening</b>.</i>
<b>gardening</b>	The activity of tending and cultivating a garden, especially as a pastime. <i>Her love of <b>gardening</b>.</i>
<b>grass</b>	Ground covered with grass. <i>The railway tracks were mostly <b>grassed</b> over.</i>
<b>herbaceous</b>	Denoting or relating to herbs (in the botanical sense).
<b>horticulture</b>	The cultivation of plants. <i>Maize and manioc <b>horticulture</b>.</i>
<b>hothouse</b>	Educate or teach (a child) to a high level at an earlier age than is usual. <i><b>Hothouse</b> plants.</i>
<b><u>marsh</u></b>	Low-lying wet land with grassy vegetation; usually is a transition zone between land and water. <i>Patches of <b>marsh</b>.</i>
<b>moss</b>	A green colour like that of moss. <i>Nature has <b>mossed</b> the gravel walks and roads.</i>
<b>plant</b>	Put or set seeds seedlings or plants into the ground. <i>He <b>planted</b> himself squarely in front of her.</i>

<b>riparian</b>	Relating to or situated on the banks of a river. <i>All the <b>riparian</b> states must sign an agreement.</i>
<b>shrub</b>	A low woody perennial plant usually having several major stems.
<b>steppe</b>	Extensive plain without trees (associated with eastern Russia and Siberia).
<b>tare</b>	A vetch, especially the common vetch.
<b>tree</b>	Force a hunted animal to take refuge in a tree. <i>Genealogical <b>tree</b>.</i>
<b>wetland</b>	A low area where the land is saturated with water. <i><b>Wetland</b> habitats.</i>
