Definitions of "Vegetation" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “vegetation” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *An abnormal growth or excrescence (especially a warty excrescence on the valves of the heart).*
- *The process of growth in plants.*
- *Inactivity that is passive and monotonous, comparable to the inactivity of plant life.*
- *Plants considered collectively, especially those found in a particular area or habitat.*
- *All the plant life in a particular region or period.*
- *The action or process of vegetating.*



Synonyms of "Vegetation" as a noun (4 Words)

- botany** The scientific study of the physiology, structure, genetics, ecology, distribution, classification, and economic importance of plants.
*The **botany** of China.*
- flora** A living organism lacking the power of locomotion.
*Britain's native **flora**.*
- plant life** Buildings for carrying on industrial labor.
- plants** An actor situated in the audience whose acting is rehearsed but seems spontaneous to the audience.
*He claimed that the evidence against him was a **plant**.*

- bog** Be prevented from making progress in a task or activity.

| clover | A herbaceous plant of the pea family, with dense globular flower heads and leaves which are typically three-lobed. It is an important fodder and rotational crop. |
| conservatory | A greenhouse in which plants are arranged in a pleasing manner. <i>Keep plant cuttings in a frost free conservatory or greenhouse.</i> |
| daisy | Used in names of other plants of the daisy family e g Michaelmas daisy Shasta daisy. |
| dandelion | A widely distributed weed of the daisy family, with a rosette of leaves and large bright yellow flowers followed by globular heads of seeds with downy tufts. |
| efflorescence | A powdery deposit on a surface. <i>Efflorescences found on the sheltered undersides of shale ledges.</i> |
| flora | All the plant life in a particular region or period. <i>The flora of southern California.</i> |
| flower | The state or period in which a plant s flowers have developed and opened. <i>A bunch of flowers.</i> |
| flowering | Capable of producing flowers, especially in contrast to a similar plant with the flowers inconspicuous or absent. <i>Winter flowering heathers.</i> |
| garden | Cultivate or work in a garden. <i>My hobby is gardening.</i> |
| gardening | The activity of tending and cultivating a garden, especially as a pastime. <i>Her love of gardening.</i> |
| grass | Ground covered with grass. <i>The railway tracks were mostly grassed over.</i> |
| herbaceous | Denoting or relating to herbs (in the botanical sense). |
| horticulture | The cultivation of plants. <i>Maize and manioc horticulture.</i> |
| hothouse | Educate or teach (a child) to a high level at an earlier age than is usual. <i>Hothouse plants.</i> |
| marsh | Low-lying wet land with grassy vegetation; usually is a transition zone between land and water. <i>Patches of marsh.</i> |
| moss | A green colour like that of moss. <i>Nature has mossed the gravel walks and roads.</i> |
| plant | Put or set seeds seedlings or plants into the ground. <i>He planted himself squarely in front of her.</i> |

| riparian | Relating to or situated on the banks of a river. <i>All the riparian states must sign an agreement.</i> |
| shrub | A low woody perennial plant usually having several major stems. |
| steppe | Extensive plain without trees (associated with eastern Russia and Siberia). |
| tare | A vetch, especially the common vetch. |
| tree | Force a hunted animal to take refuge in a tree. <i>Genealogical tree.</i> |
| wetland | A low area where the land is saturated with water. <i>Wetland habitats.</i> |
