<b><u>fervent</u></b>	Characterized by intense emotion. <i>The <b>fervent</b> heat merely communicated a genial warmth to their half torpid systems.</i>
<b>fervid</b>	Hot, burning, or glowing. <i>His <b>fervid</b> protestations of love.</i>
<b><u>fierce</u></b>	Having or displaying an intense or ferocious aggressiveness. <i><b>Fierce</b> storms lashed the country.</i>
<b>forceful</b>	Forceful and definite in expression or action. <i><b>Forceful</b> measures.</i>
<b>forcible</b>	Done by force. <i><b>Forcible</b> entry.</i>
<b><u>heated</u></b>	Made warm or hot <i>het</i> is a dialectal variant of heated. <i>A <b>heated</b> argument.</i>
<b><u>impassioned</u></b>	Filled with or showing great emotion. <i>An <b>impassioned</b> appeal.</i>
<b>intense</b>	Extremely sharp or intense. <i>The skunk s <b>intense</b> acrid odor.</i>
<b>keen</b>	Having a sharp cutting edge or point. <i>A <b>keen</b> blade.</i>
<b>passionate</b>	Arising from intense feelings of sexual love. <i>He s <b>passionate</b> about football.</i>
<b>powerful</b>	Of a person possessing physical strength and weight rugged and powerful. <i>A fast <b>powerful</b> car.</i>
<b><u>spirited</u></b>	Made lively or spirited. <i>A <b>spirited</b> debate.</i>
<b>strong</b>	Strong and sure. <i>A hostile crowd several thousands <b>strong</b>.</i>
<b>tearing</b>	Violent; extreme. <i>The <b>tearing</b> wind.</i>

<b>trigger-happy</b>	Irresponsible in the use of firearms.
<b>urgent</b>	Of an action or event done or arranged in response to an urgent situation. <i>The <b>urgent</b> words Hurry Hurry.</i>
<b>vigorous</b>	Characterized by forceful and energetic action or activity. <i>Gave her skirt a <b>vigorous</b> shake.</i>
<b>violent</b>	Marked by extreme intensity of emotions or convictions inclined to react violently fervid. <i>A <b>violent</b> rage.</i>
<b>zealous</b>	Marked by active interest and enthusiasm. <i>The council was extremely <b>zealous</b> in the application of the regulations.</i>

<b>aggressive</b>	Characteristic of an enemy or one eager to fight. <i>He was <b>aggressive</b> and imperious positive in his convictions.</i>
<b>brawl</b>	(of a stream) flow noisily. <i>He ended up <b>brawling</b> with a lout outside his house.</i>
<b>bulldog</b>	Attack viciously and ferociously. <i>The <b>bulldog</b> spirit.</i>
<b>drastic</b>	Likely to have a strong or far-reaching effect; radical and extreme. <i><b>Drastic</b> measures.</i>
<b>extremely</b>	To a high degree or extent; favorably or with much respect. <i><b>Extremely</b> cold.</i>
<b>extremist</b>	A person who holds extreme political or religious views, especially one who advocates illegal, violent, or other extreme action. <i><b>Extremist</b> political views.</i>
<b>ferocious</b>	Savagely fierce, cruel, or violent. <i>A <b>ferocious</b> beating.</i>

<b><u>ferocity</u></b>	The property of being wild or turbulent. <i>She hated him with a <b>ferocity</b> that astonished her.</i>
<b><u>fierce</u></b>	(of the weather or temperature) powerful and destructive. <i>The fire door had a <b>fierce</b> pneumatic return.</i>
<b>forceful</b>	Forceful and definite in expression or action. <i>A <b>forceful</b> personality.</i>
<b>furious</b>	As if showing violent anger. <i>He drove at a <b>furious</b> speed.</i>
<b>gusty</b>	Having or showing gusto. <i><b>Gusty</b> female vocals.</i>
<b><u>heavily</u></b>	To a large extent; very or very much. <i>She is <b>heavily</b> pregnant.</i>
<b><u>impetus</u></b>	The act of applying force suddenly. <i>The ending of the Cold War gave new <b>impetus</b> to idealism.</i>
<b>intense</b>	Extremely sharp or intense. <i><b>Intense</b> emotion.</i>
<b>irrepressible</b>	Impossible to repress or control. <i>A great shout of <b>irrepressible</b> laughter.</i>
<b>potency</b>	The power or right to give orders or make decisions. <i>The myth of declining sexual <b>potency</b> with increasing age.</i>
<b>powerful</b>	Possessing physical strength and weight rugged and powerful. <i>Walking is <b>powerful</b> hot work.</i>
<b><u>psychopath</u></b>	Someone with a sociopathic personality a person with an antisocial personality disorder psychopath was once widely used but has now been superseded by sociopath. <i>Playground <b>psychopaths</b> will gather around a fight to encourage the combatants.</i>
<b><u>rampage</u></b>	(especially of a large group of people) move through a place in a violent and uncontrollable manner. <i>Youths went on the <b>rampage</b> and wrecked a classroom.</i>
<b><u>sociopath</u></b>	Someone with a sociopathic personality a person with an antisocial personality disorder psychopath was once widely used but has now been superseded by sociopath.
<b>stormy</b>	(especially of weather) affected or characterized by storms or commotion. <i>A <b>stormy</b> argument.</i>
<b>strong</b>	Strong and sure. <i>Gave a <b>strong</b> pull on the rope.</i>

<b>superhuman</b>	Having or showing exceptional ability or powers. <i>Superhuman strength.</i>
<b>tempestuous</b>	(of the elements) as if showing violent anger. <i>A tempestuous wind.</i>
<b><u>uncontrollable</u></b>	Incapable of being controlled. <i>Uncontrollable children.</i>
<b>vehemence</b>	The property of being wild or turbulent. <i>The vehemence of his reaction.</i>
<b>violence</b>	Strength of emotion or of a destructive natural force. <i>The storm s violence.</i>
<b>violent</b>	Marked by extreme intensity of emotions or convictions inclined to react violently fervid. <i>A violent attack.</i>
