<u>fervent</u>	Characterized by intense emotion. <i>The fervent heat merely communicated a genial warmth to their half torpid systems.</i>
fervid	Hot, burning, or glowing. <i>His fervid protestations of love.</i>
<u>fierce</u>	Having or displaying an intense or ferocious aggressiveness. <i>Fierce storms lashed the country.</i>
forceful	Forceful and definite in expression or action. <i>Forceful measures.</i>
forcible	Done by force. <i>Forcible entry.</i>
<u>heated</u>	Made warm or hot <i>het</i> is a dialectal variant of heated. <i>A heated argument.</i>
<u>impassioned</u>	Filled with or showing great emotion. <i>An impassioned appeal.</i>
intense	Extremely sharp or intense. <i>The skunk s intense acrid odor.</i>
keen	Having a sharp cutting edge or point. <i>A keen blade.</i>
passionate	Arising from intense feelings of sexual love. <i>He s passionate about football.</i>
powerful	Of a person possessing physical strength and weight rugged and powerful. <i>A fast powerful car.</i>
<u>spirited</u>	Made lively or spirited. <i>A spirited debate.</i>
strong	Strong and sure. <i>A hostile crowd several thousands strong.</i>
tearing	Violent; extreme. <i>The tearing wind.</i>

trigger-happy	Irresponsible in the use of firearms.
urgent	Of an action or event done or arranged in response to an urgent situation. <i>The urgent words Hurry Hurry.</i>
vigorous	Characterized by forceful and energetic action or activity. <i>Gave her skirt a vigorous shake.</i>
violent	Marked by extreme intensity of emotions or convictions inclined to react violently fervid. <i>A violent rage.</i>
zealous	Marked by active interest and enthusiasm. <i>The council was extremely zealous in the application of the regulations.</i>

extremist	A person who holds extreme political or religious views, especially one who advocates illegal, violent, or other extreme action. <i>Extremist political views.</i>

<u>ferocity</u>	The property of being wild or turbulent. <i>She hated him with a ferocity that astonished her.</i>
<u>fierce</u>	(of the weather or temperature) powerful and destructive. <i>The fire door had a fierce pneumatic return.</i>
forceful	Forceful and definite in expression or action. <i>A forceful personality.</i>
furious	As if showing violent anger. <i>He drove at a furious speed.</i>
gusty	Having or showing gusto. <i>Gusty female vocals.</i>
<u>heavily</u>	To a large extent; very or very much. <i>She is heavily pregnant.</i>
<u>impetus</u>	The act of applying force suddenly. <i>The ending of the Cold War gave new impetus to idealism.</i>
intense	Extremely sharp or intense. <i>Intense emotion.</i>
irrepressible	Impossible to repress or control. <i>A great shout of irrepressible laughter.</i>
potency	The power or right to give orders or make decisions. <i>The myth of declining sexual potency with increasing age.</i>
powerful	Possessing physical strength and weight rugged and powerful. <i>Walking is powerful hot work.</i>
<u>psychopath</u>	Someone with a sociopathic personality a person with an antisocial personality disorder psychopath was once widely used but has now been superseded by sociopath. <i>Playground psychopaths will gather around a fight to encourage the combatants.</i>
<u>rampage</u>	(especially of a large group of people) move through a place in a violent and uncontrollable manner. <i>Youths went on the rampage and wrecked a classroom.</i>
<u>sociopath</u>	Someone with a sociopathic personality a person with an antisocial personality disorder psychopath was once widely used but has now been superseded by sociopath.
stormy	(especially of weather) affected or characterized by storms or commotion. <i>A stormy argument.</i>
strong	Strong and sure. <i>Gave a strong pull on the rope.</i>

superhuman	Having or showing exceptional ability or powers. <i>Superhuman strength.</i>
tempestuous	(of the elements) as if showing violent anger. <i>A tempestuous wind.</i>
<u>uncontrollable</u>	Incapable of being controlled. <i>Uncontrollable children.</i>
vehemence	The property of being wild or turbulent. <i>The vehemence of his reaction.</i>
violence	Strength of emotion or of a destructive natural force. <i>The storm s violence.</i>
violent	Marked by extreme intensity of emotions or convictions inclined to react violently fervid. <i>A violent attack.</i>
