### Definitions of "Vendor" as a noun

- *Someone who promotes or exchanges goods or services for money.*
- *The seller in a sale, especially of property.*
- *A person or company offering something for sale, especially a trader in the street.*



## Synonyms of "Vendor" as a noun (27 Words)

<b>assistant</b>	A person who helps in particular work. <i>A care <b>assistant</b>.</i>
<b>commercial traveller</b>	A commercially sponsored ad on radio or television.
<b>dealer</b>	A person who buys and sells goods. <i>A <b>dealer</b> in foreign stamps.</i>
<b>door-to-door salesman</b>	Anything providing a means of access (or escape).
<b>marketeer</b>	A person who works in or advocates a particular type of market. <i>Software <b>marketeers</b>.</i>
<b>marketer</b>	Someone who promotes or exchanges goods or services for money. <i>A leading manufacturer and <b>marketer</b> of medical products.</i>
<b><u>merchant</u></b>	A person who deals in something unpleasant. <i>A tea <b>merchant</b>.</i>

<b>purveyor</b>	Someone who supplies provisions (especially food). <i>A <b>purveyor</b> of large luxury vehicles.</i>
<b>retailer</b>	A merchant who sells goods at retail. <i>The big supermarkets have forced many independent <b>retailers</b> out of business.</i>
<b>sales assistant</b>	Income (at invoice values) received for goods and services over some given period of time.
<b>sales representative</b>	Income (at invoice values) received for goods and services over some given period of time.
<u><a href="#">salesman</a></u>	A man whose job involves selling or promoting commercial products, either in a shop or visiting locations to get orders. <i>An insurance <b>salesman</b>.</i>
<b>salesperson</b>	A person employed to represent a business and to sell its merchandise (as to customers in a store or to customers who are visited).
<b>saleswoman</b>	A woman salesperson. <i>A <b>saleswoman</b> came out from behind the counter and asked if she could help.</i>
<u><a href="#">seller</a></u>	A product that sells in some specified way. <i>Street <b>sell</b>ers of newspapers flowers etc.</i>
<b>shop boy</b>	A mercantile establishment for the retail sale of goods or services.
<b>shop girl</b>	Small workplace where handcrafts or manufacturing are done.
<b>shopkeeper</b>	A merchant who owns or manages a shop.
<b>shopman</b>	A male shop assistant or shopkeeper.
<b>stockist</b>	A retailer that stocks goods of a particular type for sale. <i>One of the country's largest <b>stockists</b> of Italian designer labels.</i>
<u><a href="#">supplier</a></u>	Someone whose business is to supply a particular service or commodity. <i><b>Suppliers</b> of healthcare.</i>
<b>trader</b>	Someone who purchases and maintains an inventory of goods to be sold.
<b>tradesman</b>	A person engaged in trading or a trade, typically on a relatively small scale.
<b>trafficker</b>	A person who deals or trades in something illegal. <i>A convicted drug <b>trafficker</b>.</i>

<b>travelling salesman</b>	A movement through space that changes the location of something.
<b>vender</b>	Someone who promotes or exchanges goods or services for money.
<b>wholesaler</b>	Someone who buys large quantities of goods and resells to merchants rather than to the ultimate customers. <i>Chicken supplied by <b>wholesalers</b> to restaurants.</i>

## Associations of "Vendor" (30 Words)

<b>automat</b>	A cafeteria in which food and drink were obtained from slot machines.
<b>bazaar</b>	A market in a Middle Eastern country. <i>The church <b>bazaar</b>.</i>
<b>clerk</b>	Work as a clerk as in the legal business. <i>A chapter <b>clerk</b>.</i>
<b>clothier</b>	A person or company that makes or sells clothes or cloth.
<b>employee</b>	A person employed for wages or salary, especially at non-executive level.
<b>fishmonger</b>	A person or shop that sells fish for food.
<b>furrier</b>	A person who prepares or deals in furs. <i>I came across a very classy <b>furrier</b> s in Nottingham.</i>

<b>grocery</b>	Items of food sold in a grocery or supermarket. <i>The <b>grocery</b> store included a meat market.</i>
<b>huckster</b>	A person who writes radio or tv advertisements. <i>He was <b>huckstering</b> a video.</i>
<b>market</b>	The free market. <i>The company is <b>marketing</b> its new line of beauty products.</i>
<b>marketer</b>	A person or company that advertises or promotes something. <i>A leading manufacturer and <b>marketer</b> of medical products.</i>
<b>marketplace</b>	The world of commercial activity where goods and services are bought and sold. <i>They were driven from the <b>marketplace</b>.</i>
<b>mart</b>	An area in a town where a public mercantile establishment is set up. <i>A liquor <b>mart</b>.</i>
<b>merchant</b>	In historical contexts relating to merchants or commerce. <i>A <b>merchant</b> of death.</i>
<b>outsell</b>	Sell more than others. <i>This salesman <b>outsells</b> his colleagues.</i>
<b>peddle</b>	Sell (an illegal drug or stolen item). <i>He was arrested after trying to <b>peddle</b> guns.</i>
<b>purchaser</b>	A person who buys. <i>One of the club's prospective <b>purchasers</b>.</i>
<b>salesman</b>	A man whose job involves selling or promoting commercial products, either in a shop or visiting locations to get orders. <i>An insurance <b>salesman</b>.</i>
<b>salesperson</b>	A person employed to represent a business and to sell its merchandise (as to customers in a store or to customers who are visited).
<b>sell</b>	Sell all of one's stock of something. <i>The store <b>sells</b> his TVs, videos and other electrical goods.</i>
<b>seller</b>	Someone who promotes or exchanges goods or services for money. <i>Street <b>sellers</b> of newspapers, flowers etc.</i>
<b>shopkeeper</b>	The owner and manager of a shop.
<b>store</b>	A large shop selling different types of goods. <i>He keeps the shop's <b>stores</b>.</i>
<b>subcontractor</b>	A firm or person that carries out work for a company as part of a larger project.
<b>trader</b>	A person who buys and sells goods, currency, or shares.

- transact** Conduct or carry out (business).  
*Transact with foreign governments.*
- undersell** Sell something at a lower price than (a competitor).  
*She feels she was **underselling** herself by putting her disability high on her CV.*
- vend** Offer (small items) for sale, either from a stall or from a slot machine.  
*There was a man **vending** sticky cakes and ices.*
- vintner** Someone who sells wine.
- wholesale** At a wholesale price.  
*Bottles from this region sell **wholesale** at about 72 a case.*
