Definitions of "Venerate" as a verb

- *Regard with great respect; revere.*
- *Regard with feelings of respect and reverence; consider hallowed or exalted or be in awe of.*

*I **fear** for the city with this madman let loose in it.*

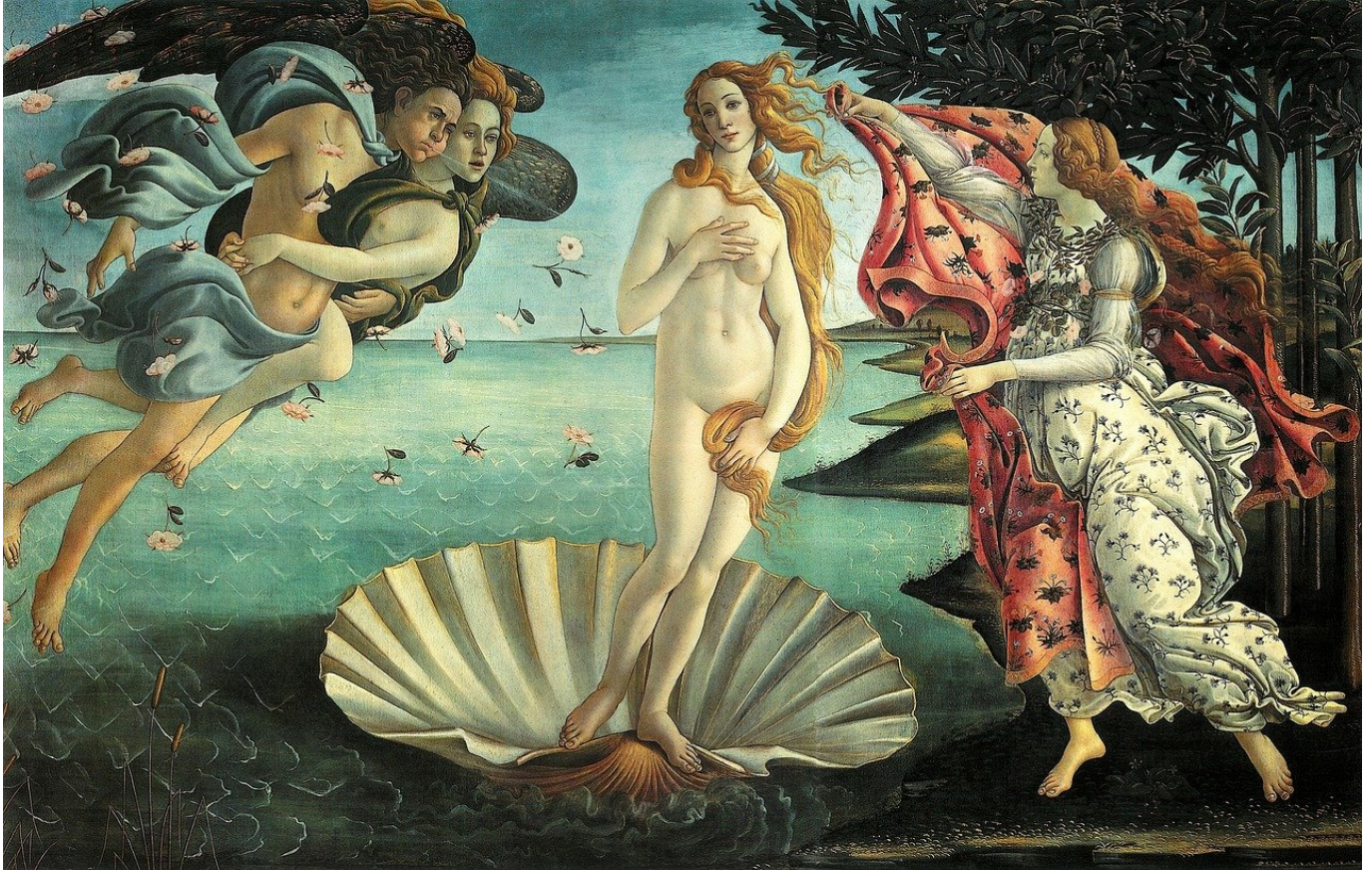
honoured Bestow honor or rewards upon.

revere Regard with feelings of respect and reverence consider hallowed or exalted or be in awe of.
*C zanne s still lifes were **revered** by his contemporaries.*

revered Regard with feelings of respect and reverence; consider hallowed or exalted or be in awe of.

Regard with feelings of respect and reverence consider hallowed or exalted or **reverence** be in awe of.

*The many divine beings **reverenced** by Hindu tradition.*



Usage Examples of "Venerate" as a verb

- *Philip of Beverley was venerated as a saint.*
- *We venerate genius.*



Associations of "Venerate" (30 Words)

- admiration** The feeling aroused by something strange and surprising.
*They were lost in **admiration** of the scenery.*
- admire** Look at (something impressive or attractive) with pleasure.
*I **admire** your courage.*
- adoration** Worship; veneration.
*It was enough to earn him the **adoration** of the fans.*
- adored** Regarded with deep or rapturous love (especially as if for a god).
***Adored** grandchildren.*
- benediction** The state of being blessed.
*He said the **benediction**.*
- blessing** A person's sanction or support.
*It s a **blessing** we re alive.*
- canonize** Treat or regard as being above reproach or of great significance.
*After he was shown to have performed a miracle the priest was **canonized**.*

commend	Present as suitable for approval or acceptance recommend. <i>Most one roomed flats have little to commend them.</i>
congratulate	Pride or congratulate oneself for an achievement. <i>She congratulated herself on her powers of deduction.</i>
defer	Postpone the conscription of (someone). <i>He was no longer deferred from the draft.</i>
<u>deference</u>	Courteous regard for people's feelings. <i>His deference to her wishes was very flattering.</i>
deify	Exalt to the position of a God. <i>These young men deify financial success.</i>
esteem	The condition of being honored esteemed or respected or well regarded. <i>He was held in high esteem by colleagues.</i>
exalt	Raise in rank, character, or status. <i>Romanticism liberated the imagination and exalted the emotions.</i>
<u>flatter</u>	Lavish praise and compliments on (someone), often insincerely and with the aim of furthering one's own interests. <i>The final scoreline flattered England.</i>
<u>glowing</u>	The amount of electromagnetic radiation leaving or arriving at a point on a surface. <i>Glowing praise.</i>
<u>homage</u>	Respectful deference. <i>A man doing homage to his personal lord.</i>
honor	The state of being honored. <i>We honor checks and drafts.</i>
idolatry	The worship of idols. <i>We must not allow our idolatry of art to obscure issues of political significance.</i>
<u>idolize</u>	Love unquestioningly and uncritically or to excess; venerate as an idol. <i>Many teenagers idolized the Beatles.</i>
laud	Praise, glorify, or honor. <i>The obituary lauded him as a great statesman and soldier.</i>
laudatory	(of speech or writing) expressing praise and commendation. <i>Enthusiastic and laudatory articles.</i>
obeisance	A gesture expressing deferential respect, such as a bow or curtsy. <i>She made a deep obeisance.</i>
praise	Offering words of homage as an act of worship. <i>We praise God for past blessings.</i>

respect	The state of being admired or respected. <i>He inspires respect.</i>
respectful	Feeling or manifesting veneration. <i>They sit in respectful silence.</i>
revere	Regard with feelings of respect and reverence consider hallowed or exalted or be in awe of. <i>C zanne s still lifes were revered by his contemporaries.</i>
reverence	Regard with feelings of respect and reverence consider hallowed or exalted or be in awe of. <i>The many divine beings reverenced by Hindu tradition.</i>
veneration	Religious zeal; the willingness to serve God. <i>The traditional veneration of saints.</i>
worship	The activity of worshipping. <i>Worship of the Mother Goddess.</i>
