Synonyms of "Veracity" as a noun (12 Words)

accuracy	The quality or state of being correct or precise. <i>He was beginning to doubt the accuracy of his compass.</i>
accurateness	The state or quality of being accurate; accuracy; †carefulness (obsolete).
authenticity	Undisputed credibility. <i>The paper should have established the authenticity of the documents before publishing them.</i>
<u>correctness</u>	Conformity to accepted social standards. <i>There was evidence to support the correctness of the identification.</i>

exactness	The quality of being exact. <i>It is impossible to calculate with mathematical exactness.</i>
faithfulness	The quality of being faithful; fidelity. <i>Faithfulness in marriage.</i>
fidelity	The degree of exactness with which something is copied or reproduced. <i>His fidelity to liberal ideals.</i>
preciseness	The quality of being reproducible in amount or performance. <i>He handled it with the preciseness of an automaton.</i>
<u>precision</u>	Refinement in a measurement, calculation, or specification, especially as represented by the number of digits given. <i>A precision instrument.</i>
<u>realism</u>	The doctrine that universals or abstract concepts have an objective or absolute existence The theory that universals have their own reality is sometimes called Platonic realism because it was first outlined by Plato's doctrine of forms or ideas. <i>British soaps will stay because of their gritty realism.</i>
truth	A fact that has been verified. <i>They debated the truth of the proposition.</i>
<u>truthfulness</u>	The fact of being true; truth. <i>The truthfulness of her playing of an ageing American spinster.</i>

Usage Examples of "Veracity" as a noun

- *Voters should be concerned about his veracity and character.*
- *Officials expressed doubts concerning the veracity of the story.*

Associations of "Veracity" (30 Words)

accuracy	The quality or state of being correct or precise. <i>The accuracy of radiocarbon dating.</i>
<u>actual</u>	Being or existing at the present moment. <i>The book could be condensed into half the space but what of the actual content.</i>
authenticity	Undisputed credibility. <i>The paper should have established the authenticity of the documents before publishing them.</i>

<u>candid</u>	Truthful and straightforward; frank. <i>It is better to let the photographer mingle among the guests and take candid shots.</i>
<u>candor</u>	The quality of being honest and straightforward in attitude and speech.
candour	Ability to make judgments free from discrimination or dishonesty. <i>A man of refreshing candour.</i>
fact	A piece of information about circumstances that exist or events that have occurred. <i>There was a question of fact as to whether they had received the letter.</i>
forthrightness	The quality of being honest and straightforward in attitude and speech.
frank	Unmistakable; obvious. <i>Kate looked at Sam with frank admiration.</i>
<u>frankly</u>	Used to emphasize the truth of a statement, however unpalatable this may be. <i>She talks very frankly about herself.</i>
<u>genuine</u>	Being or reflecting the essential or genuine character of something. <i>A genuine dilemma.</i>
guileless	Free of deceit. <i>His face once so open and guileless.</i>
<u>honest</u>	Free of deceit; truthful and sincere. <i>An honest wage.</i>
<u>honesty</u>	A European plant with purple or white flowers and round, flat, translucent seed pods which are used for indoor flower arrangements. <i>There s a well stocked honesty bar which includes local wine.</i>
integrity	The condition of being unified or sound in construction. <i>They admired his scrupulous professional integrity.</i>
naivete	Innocence or unsophistication. <i>His greatest fault was his political naïvet.</i>
<u>openness</u>	Lack of secrecy or concealment; frankness. <i>Total openness to all points of view.</i>
probity	Complete and confirmed integrity; having strong moral principles. <i>He enjoys an exaggerated reputation for probity.</i>
real	Really very. <i>The real reason.</i>
rectitude	Righteousness as a consequence of being honorable and honest. <i>Mattie is a model of rectitude.</i>

<u>sincere</u>	(of a person) saying what they genuinely feel or believe; not dishonest or hypocritical. <i>They offer their sincere thanks to Paul.</i>
<u>sincerity</u>	The absence of pretence, deceit, or hypocrisy. <i>They demanded some proof of my sincerity.</i>
transparency	The quality of being clear and transparent. <i>The transparency of ice.</i>
truth	A fact or belief that is accepted as true. <i>They debated the truth of the proposition.</i>
truthful	Telling or expressing the truth; honest. <i>Gave truthful testimony.</i>
<u>truthfulness</u>	The fact of being true; truth. <i>The truthfulness of her playing of an ageing American spinster.</i>
unflinching	Not showing fear or hesitation in the face of danger or difficulty. <i>He has shown unflinching determination throughout the campaign.</i>
uprightness	The condition or quality of being honourable or honest; rectitude. <i>Steadying himself he slowly managed to achieve a state of relative uprightness.</i>
veracious	Habitually speaking the truth. <i>A veracious witness.</i>
verification	The process of ensuring that procedures laid down in weapons limitation agreements are followed. <i>The verification of official documents.</i>
