### Synonyms of "Verbatim" as an adjective (8 Words)

<b>close</b>	Fitting closely but comfortably. A <b>close</b> translation.
<b>direct</b>	Of a current flowing in one direction only. <b>Direct</b> current.

<b>exact</b>	(of ideas, images, representations, expressions) characterized by perfect conformity to fact or truth; strictly correct. <i>Hit the <b>exact</b> center of the target.</i>
<b>faithful</b>	Remaining loyal and steadfast. <i>The film was <b>faithful</b> to the book.</i>
<b>literal</b>	Of, in, or expressed by a letter or the letters of the alphabet. <b>Literal</b> mnemonics.
<b>precise</b>	Characterized by perfect conformity to fact or truth ; strictly correct. <b>Precise</b> directions.
<b>strict</b>	Characterized by strictness severity or restraint. <i>A <b>strict</b> upbringing.</i>
<b>undeviating</b>	Showing no deviation; constant and steady. <b>Undeviating</b> loyalty.

### Definitions of "Verbatim" as an adverb

- *In exactly the same words as were used originally.*
- *Using exactly the same words.*

### Synonyms of "Verbatim" as an adverb (9 Words)

<b>closely</b>	Very affectionately or intimately. <i>We will be working <b>closely</b> with stakeholders.</i>
<b>exactly</b>	Just as it should be. <i>They met in 1989 and got married <b>exactly</b> two years later.</i>
<b>faithfully</b>	In a faithful manner. <i>He swore that he would serve the king <b>faithfully</b>.</i>

**in every detail** To or toward the inside of.

**literally** Used for emphasis while not being literally true.  
*I was **literally** blown away by the response I got.*

**precisely** Used as a reply to confirm or agree with a previous statement.  
*Kids will love it **precisely** because it will irritate their parents.*

**religiously** By religion.  
*The **religiously** based school.*

**rigorously** In a rigorous manner.  
*The court **rigorously** scrutinises the settlement.*

**strictly** With no exceptions; completely or absolutely.  
***Strictly** speaking ham is a cured cooked leg of pork.*

## Usage Examples of "Verbatim" as an adverb

- *He repeated her remarks verbatim.*
- *Subjects were instructed to recall the passage verbatim.*

## Associations of "Verbatim" (30 Words)

**accurate** Of an instrument or method capable of giving accurate information.  
***Accurate** measurements.*

**accurately** In a way that is correct in all details; exactly.  
*We are simply unable to predict long term trends **accurately**.*

**actually** At the present moment.  
*He had a thick Cockney accent he sounded like my grandad **actually**.*

**copy** Send a copy of a letter or an email to a third party.  
*The problem is telling which is the original document and which the **copy**.*

**correct** Make right or correct.  
*He had assumed she was married and she had not **corrected** him.*

**correctly** In a way that is true, factual or appropriate; accurately.  
*The flower had been **correctly** depicted by his son.*

**dah** The longer of the two telegraphic signals used in Morse code.

**detailed** Developed or executed with care and in minute detail- John Buchan.  
*More **detailed** information was needed.*

**direct** Direct the course determine the direction of travelling.  
*I **directed** them towards the town hall.*

<b>exact</b>	(of ideas, images, representations, expressions) characterized by perfect conformity to fact or truth; strictly correct. <i>An <b>exact</b> copy.</i>
<b>exactitude</b>	The quality of being exact. <i>It is not possible to say with any scientific <b>exactitude</b> what a dream means.</i>
<b>exactly</b>	Used as a reply to confirm or agree with what has just been said. <i>What <b>exactly</b> are you looking for.</i>
<b>factually</b>	As a fact or based on fact. <i>His assertion is <b>factually</b> incorrect.</i>
<b>justly</b>	With honesty. <i>We can <b>justly</b> be proud of our achievements.</i>
<b>justness</b>	Conformity with some esthetic standard of correctness or propriety. <i>It was performed with <b>justness</b> and beauty.</i>
<b>literally</b>	Used for emphasis while not being literally true. <i>Tiramisu <b>literally</b> translated pull me up.</i>
<b>marked</b>	Strongly marked easily noticeable. <i>The word drake is semantically <b>marked</b> as masculine.</i>
<b>perusal</b>	The action of reading or examining something. <i>I continued my <b>perusal</b> of the instructions.</i>
<b>precise</b>	(of ideas, images, representations, expressions) characterized by perfect conformity to fact or truth; strictly correct. <i>A <b>precise</b> mind.</i>
<b>precisely</b>	In a precise manner. <i>He was doing <b>precisely</b> or exactly what she had told him to do.</i>
<b>punctuality</b>	The quality or habit of adhering to an appointed time. <i>Improvements in the <b>punctuality</b> of trains.</i>
<b>real</b>	Used as intensifiers real is sometimes used informally for really rattling is informal. <i>An increase in <b>real</b> terms of 11.6 per cent.</i>
<b>really</b>	Used as intensifiers real is sometimes used informally for really rattling is informal. <i>I'm sorry Ruth I <b>really</b> am.</i>
<b>reliably</b>	In a consistently good or accurate way. <i>Few of these paintings can be <b>reliably</b> dated.</i>
<b>right</b>	In the right manner correctly suitably. <i>The <b>right</b> side of the cloth showed the pattern.</i>

*Keep **straight** on.*
- summarize** Be a summary of.  
*I will now **summarize**.*
- transcript** An official record of a student's work, showing courses taken and grades achieved.  
*You can obtain a **transcript** of this radio program by sending a self addressed envelope to the station.*
- truly** In accordance with truth or fact or reality.  
*Management does not **truly** understand about the residents.*
- very** Emphasizing an extreme point in time or space.  
*Those were his **very** words.*
