- *Of the bright green colour of lush grass.*
- *Characterized by abundance of verdure.*



### Synonyms of "Verdant" as an adjective (4 Words)

**grass-covered** Covered with grass.

**grassy** Characteristic of or resembling grass.  
*Grassy slopes.*

**green** Of a ski run of the lowest level of difficulty as indicated by green markers on the run.  
*A green salad.*

**leafy** Resembling a leaf or leaves.  
*Leafy trees.*

## Associations of "Verdant" (30 Words)

<b>berry</b>	A small fruit having any of various structures e g simple grape or blueberry or aggregate blackberry or raspberry. <i>Let s go <b>berrying</b>.</i>
<b>broadleaf</b>	Having relatively broad rather than needlelike or scalelike leaves.
<b>cornfield</b>	A field in which corn is being grown.
<b>deforestation</b>	The state of being clear of trees. <i><b>Deforestation</b> caused by foreign logging companies.</i>
<b>dill</b>	Aromatic threadlike foliage of the dill plant used as seasoning.
<b>floodplain</b>	An area of low-lying ground adjacent to a river, formed mainly of river sediments and subject to flooding.
<b>flora</b>	A book or other work detailing the plants of a particular region or habitat. <i>Britain s native <b>flora</b>.</i>

<b>forest</b>	Establish a forest on previously unforested land. <i>A <b>forest</b> of high rise apartments.</i>
<b>fresh</b>	Having an unpleasant, slightly rotten smell. <i>A <b>fresh</b> shirt.</i>
<b>glade</b>	A tract of land with few or no trees in the middle of a wooded area. <i><b>Glades</b> of birch.</i>
<b>grass</b>	Cover with grass. <i>The railway tracks were mostly <b>grassed</b> over.</i>
<b>grassy</b>	Abounding in grass. <i>An intense <b>grassy</b> green.</i>
<b>greenery</b>	Green foliage, growing plants, or vegetation.
<b>jungle</b>	A wild tangled mass of vegetation or other things. <i>It s a <b>jungle</b> out there.</i>
<b>lea</b>	A field covered with grass or herbage and suitable for grazing by livestock. <i>The lowing herd winds slowly o er the <b>lea</b>.</i>
<b>lush</b>	(of vegetation, especially grass) growing luxuriantly. <i>These architecture magazines are full of the <b>lush</b> interiors of the rich and famous.</i>
<b>meadow</b>	A field where grass or alfalfa are grown to be made into hay. <i>A pleasant campsite in a <b>meadow</b> complete with sparkling stream.</i>
<b>orchard</b>	A piece of enclosed land planted with fruit trees. <i>A cider <b>orchard</b>.</i>
<b>pasture</b>	Let feed in a field or pasture or meadow. <i>A range of <b>pasture</b> grasses.</i>
<b>prairie</b>	A steam locomotive of 2-6-2 wheel arrangement.
<b>rainforest</b>	A forest with heavy annual rainfall. <i>Tracts of <b>rainforest</b>.</i>
<b>rake</b>	Draw together with a rake or similar implement. <i>She <b>raked</b> a comb through her hair.</i>
<b>savanna</b>	A flat grassland in tropical or subtropical regions.
<b>sod</b>	Cover with sod. <i>The poor <b>sod</b> couldn t even buy a drink.</i>
<b>tare</b>	(in biblical use) an injurious weed resembling corn when young (Matt. 13:24-30).
<b>timber</b>	A beam made of wood. <i>The exploitation of forests for <b>timber</b>.</i>

- tree** Chase an animal up a tree.  
*This lot should be **treed** so that the house will be shaded in summer.*
- tropical** Very hot and humid.  
***Tropical** weather.*
- woodland** Land that is covered with trees and shrubs.  
*Large areas of ancient **woodland**.*
