| floodplain | An area of low-lying ground adjacent to a river, formed mainly of river sediments and subject to flooding. |
| flora | A book or other work detailing the plants of a particular region or habitat. <i>Britain s native flora.</i> |

| forest | Establish a forest on previously unforested land. <i>A forest of high rise apartments.</i> |
| fresh | Having an unpleasant, slightly rotten smell. <i>A fresh shirt.</i> |
| glade | A tract of land with few or no trees in the middle of a wooded area. <i>Glades of birch.</i> |
| grass | Cover with grass. <i>The railway tracks were mostly grassed over.</i> |
| grassy | Abounding in grass. <i>An intense grassy green.</i> |
| greenery | Green foliage, growing plants, or vegetation. |
| jungle | A wild tangled mass of vegetation or other things. <i>It s a jungle out there.</i> |
| lea | A field covered with grass or herbage and suitable for grazing by livestock. <i>The lowing herd winds slowly o er the lea.</i> |
| lush | (of vegetation, especially grass) growing luxuriantly. <i>These architecture magazines are full of the lush interiors of the rich and famous.</i> |
| meadow | A field where grass or alfalfa are grown to be made into hay. <i>A pleasant campsite in a meadow complete with sparkling stream.</i> |
| orchard | A piece of enclosed land planted with fruit trees. <i>A cider orchard.</i> |
| pasture | Let feed in a field or pasture or meadow. <i>A range of pasture grasses.</i> |
| prairie | A steam locomotive of 2-6-2 wheel arrangement. |
| rainforest | A forest with heavy annual rainfall. <i>Tracts of rainforest.</i> |
| rake | Draw together with a rake or similar implement. <i>She raked a comb through her hair.</i> |
| savanna | A flat grassland in tropical or subtropical regions. |
| sod | Cover with sod. <i>The poor sod couldn t even buy a drink.</i> |
| tare | (in biblical use) an injurious weed resembling corn when young (Matt. 13:24-30). |
| timber | A beam made of wood. <i>The exploitation of forests for timber.</i> |

- tropical** Very hot and humid.

- woodland** Land that is covered with trees and shrubs.
