eligible Qualified for or allowed or worthy of being chosen.

Customers who are **eligible** for discounts.

empirical

Derived from experiment and observation rather than theory.

An **empirical** treatment of a disease about which little is known.

empiricism (philosophy) the doctrine that knowledge derives from experience.

experimental Relying on observation or experiment.

An **experimental** drug.

indefeasible Not liable to being annulled or voided or undone.

An **indefeasible** claim to the title.

Marked by an orderly logical and aesthetically consistent relation of parts.

Rain was a **logical** expectation given the time of year.

objectively In a way that is not dependent on the mind for existence; actually.

The physical world we think of as **objectively** true.

observable Capable of being seen or noticed.

An **observable** change in behavior.

observational Relying on observation or experiment.

A master of **observational** comedy.

The appearance of viewed objects with regard to their relative position,

perspective distance from the viewer, etc.

The theory and practice of **perspective**.

Established beyond doubt.

A system based on **proven** technologies.

provenanceThe beginning of something's existence; something's origin.

An orange rug of Iranian **provenance**.

The theological doctrine that human reason rather than divine revelation

rationalism establishes religious truth.

Scientific rationalism.

reasonable (of a price or product) not too expensive.

A police officer may use **reasonable** force to gain entry.



Of a letter or parcel sent by registered post.
