multitalented	Having many skills or talents. <i>A multitalented musician and songwriter.</i>
not fixed	Securely placed or fastened or set.
not settled	Inhabited by colonists.
open	Open to or in view of all. <i>An issue open to question.</i>
open to change	Used of mouth or eyes.
open-ended	Allowing for future changes or revisions.
protean	Able to do many different things; versatile. <i>It is difficult to comprehend the whole of this protean subject.</i>
<u>resourceful</u>	Having the ability to find quick and clever ways to overcome difficulties. <i>The most resourceful cook in town.</i>
variable	Marked by diversity or difference. <i>The quality of hospital food is highly variable.</i>
<u>various</u>	Distinctly dissimilar or unlike. <i>His disguises are many and various.</i>

labile	Liable to change. <i>We may be the most labile culture in all history.</i>
limber	Cause to become limber. <i>I have to practise to keep myself limber.</i>
<u>malleable</u>	(of a metal or other material) able to be hammered or pressed into shape without breaking or cracking. <i>A malleable metal can be beaten into a sheet.</i>
manifold	A collection of points forming a certain kind of set, such as those of a topologically closed surface or an analogue of this in three or more dimensions. <i>Our manifold failings.</i>
metamorphic	Of or relating to metamorphosis (especially of rocks). Metamorphic stage.
miscellaneous	(of items or people gathered or considered together) of various types or from different sources. <i>A miscellaneous collection of well known ne er do wells.</i>
modified	Changed in form or character. <i>Their modified stand made the issue more acceptable.</i>
<u>multifaceted</u>	Having many aspects or qualities. <i>A multifaceted undertaking.</i>
multifarious	Having many varied parts or aspects. Multifarious activities.
<u>pliable</u>	Easily bent; flexible. Pliable teenage minds.
pliant	Easily bent. <i>A pliant nature.</i>
pluralism	The practice of one person holding more than one benefice at a time.
protean	Able to do many different things; versatile. <i>Eyes of that baffling protean grey which is never twice the same.</i>
readjust	Set or adjust (something) again. <i>It can take years to readjust to this situation.</i>
redeemable	Susceptible to improvement or reform. <i>A redeemable coupon.</i>

- supple** (used of persons' bodies) capable of moving or bending freely.
*This body oil leaves your skin feeling deliciously **supple**.*
- transformed** Given a completely different form or appearance.
*Shocked to see the **transformed** landscape.*
- useful** Having a useful function.
*Aspirins are **useful** for headaches.*
- variable** The region of light variable winds to the north of the north east trade winds or in the southern hemisphere between the south east trade winds and the westerlies.
*There are too many **variables** involved to make any meaningful predictions.*
- varied** Characterized by variety.
*Her quickly **varied** answers indicated uncertainty.*
- various** Having great diversity or variety.
*Cited **various** reasons for his behavior.*
- yielding** The act of conceding or yielding.
*A gentle **yielding** person.*
