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## Associations of "Vested" (30 Words)

<a href="#">absolute</a>	Perfect or complete or pure. <i><b>Absolute</b> moral standards.</i>
<b>arrant</b>	Complete, utter. <i>An <b>arrant</b> fool.</i>
<b>barren</b>	A barren tract or tracts of land. <i>The Greeks were seen to drive a <b>barren</b> of mules.</i>
<a href="#">bleak</a>	(of a situation) not hopeful or encouraging; unlikely to have a favourable outcome. <i>A <b>bleak</b> and barren moor.</i>
<b>categorical</b>	Unambiguously explicit and direct. <i>A <b>categorical</b> denial.</i>
<b>complete</b>	Complete or carry out. <i>A <b>complete</b> set of china.</i>
<b>desolate</b>	Make (a place) appear bleakly empty. <i>The droughts that <b>desolated</b> the dry plains.</i>
<b>encase</b>	Enclose or cover in a case or close-fitting surround. <i>Each was <b>encased</b> in a plastic shrink wrap.</i>
<b>enunciate</b>	Speak, pronounce, or utter in a certain way. <i>She <b>enunciated</b> each word slowly.</i>
<b>have</b>	Have ownership or possession of. <i>I <b>have</b> two years left.</i>
<a href="#">imperative</a>	Relating to verbs in the imperative mood. <i>Immediate action was <b>imperative</b>.</i>
<b>infertile</b>	(of land) unable to sustain crops or vegetation. <i>An <b>infertile</b> couple.</i>
<b>inviolable</b>	Must be kept sacred. <i>Fortifications that made the frontier <b>inviolable</b>.</i>

<b>invulnerable</b>	Immune to attack; impregnable. <i>No state in the region is now <b>invulnerable</b> to attack by another.</i>
<b>irrevocably</b>	In a way that cannot be changed, reversed, or recovered. <i>Our environment will be <b>irrevocably</b> damaged.</i>
<b>own</b>	Have something as one's own possess. <i>I emphasize the importance of <b>owning</b> our anger and finding ways to control it.</i>
<b>perfectly</b>	In a manner or way that could not be better. <i>You know <b>perfectly</b> well I can't stay.</i>
<b>procure</b>	Persuade or cause (someone) to do something. <i>He persuaded a friend to <b>procure</b> him a ticket.</i>
<b>property</b>	Shares or investments in property. <i>Self confidence is not an endearing <b>property</b>.</i>
<b>protection</b>	Protection money paid to criminals especially on a regular basis. <i>Insurance provided <b>protection</b> against loss of wages due to illness.</i>
<b>securely</b>	In a manner free from fear or risk. <i>Only about 35 pictures can be <b>securely</b> attributed to him.</i>
<b>staring</b>	Open and fixed as if in fear or wonder. <i>Stark <b>staring</b> mad.</i>
<b>stark</b>	Severe or bare in appearance or outline. <i>The dragoons were <b>stark</b> fellows.</i>
<b>thoroughgoing</b>	Without qualification; used informally as (often pejorative) intensifiers. <i><b>Thoroughgoing</b> research.</i>
<b>totally</b>	Used to emphasize a clause or statement. <i>Some of the lyrics are <b>totally</b> brilliant.</i>
<b>unadulterated</b>	Not mixed or diluted with any different or extra elements; complete and absolute. <i><b>Unadulterated</b> whole milk yogurt.</i>
<b>unconditional</b>	Not contingent; not determined or influenced by someone or something else. <i><b>Unconditional</b> surrender.</i>
<b>unmitigated</b>	Not diminished or moderated in intensity or severity; sometimes used as an intensifier. <i>The tour had been an <b>unmitigated</b> disaster.</i>
<b>unqualified</b>	Having no right or entitlement. <i>No company would permit an <b>unqualified</b> accountant to audit its books.</i>
