absolute	Perfect or complete or pure. <i>Absolute moral standards.</i>
arrant	Complete, utter. <i>An arrant fool.</i>
barren	A barren tract or tracts of land. <i>The Greeks were seen to drive a barren of mules.</i>
bleak	(of a situation) not hopeful or encouraging; unlikely to have a favourable outcome. <i>A bleak and barren moor.</i>
categorical	Unambiguously explicit and direct. <i>A categorical denial.</i>
complete	Complete or carry out. <i>A complete set of china.</i>
desolate	Make (a place) appear bleakly empty. <i>The droughts that desolated the dry plains.</i>
encase	Enclose or cover in a case or close-fitting surround. <i>Each was encased in a plastic shrink wrap.</i>
enunciate	Speak, pronounce, or utter in a certain way. <i>She enunciated each word slowly.</i>
have	Have ownership or possession of. <i>I have two years left.</i>
imperative	Relating to verbs in the imperative mood. <i>Immediate action was imperative.</i>
infertile	(of land) unable to sustain crops or vegetation. <i>An infertile couple.</i>
inviolable	Must be kept sacred. <i>Fortifications that made the frontier inviolable.</i>

invulnerable	Immune to attack; impregnable. <i>No state in the region is now invulnerable to attack by another.</i>
irrevocably	In a way that cannot be changed, reversed, or recovered. <i>Our environment will be irrevocably damaged.</i>
own	Have something as one's own possess. <i>I emphasize the importance of owning our anger and finding ways to control it.</i>
perfectly	In a manner or way that could not be better. <i>You know perfectly well I can't stay.</i>
procure	Persuade or cause (someone) to do something. <i>He persuaded a friend to procure him a ticket.</i>
property	Shares or investments in property. <i>Self confidence is not an endearing property.</i>
protection	Protection money paid to criminals especially on a regular basis. <i>Insurance provided protection against loss of wages due to illness.</i>
securely	In a manner free from fear or risk. <i>Only about 35 pictures can be securely attributed to him.</i>
staring	Open and fixed as if in fear or wonder. <i>Stark staring mad.</i>
stark	Severe or bare in appearance or outline. <i>The dragoons were stark fellows.</i>
thoroughgoing	Without qualification; used informally as (often pejorative) intensifiers. <i>Thoroughgoing research.</i>
totally	Used to emphasize a clause or statement. <i>Some of the lyrics are totally brilliant.</i>
unadulterated	Not mixed or diluted with any different or extra elements; complete and absolute. <i>Unadulterated whole milk yogurt.</i>
unconditional	Not contingent; not determined or influenced by someone or something else. <i>Unconditional surrender.</i>
unmitigated	Not diminished or moderated in intensity or severity; sometimes used as an intensifier. <i>The tour had been an unmitigated disaster.</i>
unqualified	Having no right or entitlement. <i>No company would permit an unqualified accountant to audit its books.</i>

Express audibly utter sounds not necessarily words.
*He **uttered** strange sounds that nobody could understand.*
