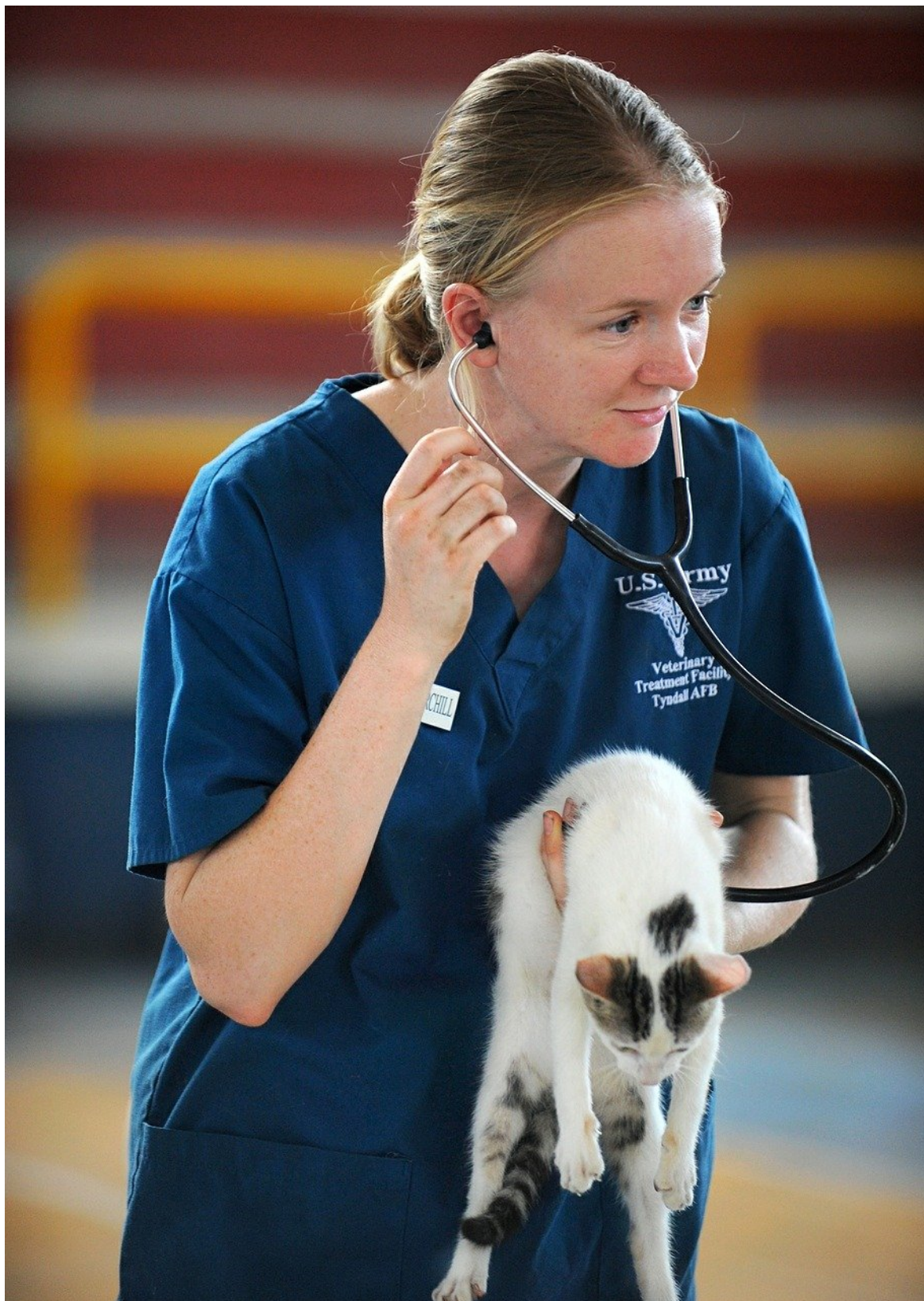
- appraise** Consider in a comprehensive way.

- weigh up** To be oppressive or burdensome.

ferret	Hunt with ferrets. <i>He shambled over to the desk and ferreted around.</i>
forefoot	A front foot of a quadruped.
homeopathy	A method of treating disease with small amounts of remedies that, in large amounts in healthy people, produce symptoms similar to those being treated.
hospital	An institution providing medical and surgical treatment and nursing care for sick or injured people. <i>Christ's Hospital.</i>
<u>massage</u>	Give a massage to. <i>Massage can ease tiredness.</i>
medic	A medical practitioner or student.
medicinal	A medicinal substance. <i>Medicinal herbs.</i>

midwife	A woman skilled in aiding the delivery of babies. <i>These women midwifed her.</i>
orthopedist	A specialist in correcting deformities of the skeletal system (especially in children).
osteopath	A therapist who manipulates the skeleton and muscles.
pediatrics	The branch of medicine concerned with the treatment of infants and children.
pet	A fit of petulance or sulkiness especially at what is felt to be a slight. <i>Don t cry pet it s all right.</i>
pharmacist	A person who is professionally qualified to prepare and dispense medicinal drugs.
physician	A licensed medical practitioner. <i>Physicians of the soul.</i>
practitioner	A person actively engaged in an art, discipline, or profession, especially medicine. <i>Patients are treated by skilled practitioners.</i>

pug	Small compact smooth-coated breed of Asiatic origin having a tightly curled tail and broad flat wrinkled muzzle.
puppy	A person or thing of a specified kind. <i>You ungrateful puppy.</i>
