| <b>ferret</b>          | Hunt with ferrets.<br><i>She <b>ferreted</b> out the truth.</i>  |
| <b>forefoot</b>        | Each of the front feet of a four-footed animal.  |
| <b>homeopathy</b>      | A system of complementary medicine in which ailments are treated by minute doses of natural substances that in larger amounts would produce symptoms of the ailment. |
