| anesthetize | Administer an anesthetic drug to. <i>Anesthetize the gum before extracting the teeth.</i> |
| avian | Relating to birds. <i>Avian tuberculosis.</i> |
| badger | A native or resident of Wisconsin. <i>Tom had finally badgered her into going.</i> |
| bulldog | Wrestle (a steer) to the ground by holding its horns and twisting its neck. <i>Cowboys compete in bulldogging and bareback riding.</i> |
| chiroprapist | A specialist in care for the feet. <i>She decided to train as a chiroprapist.</i> |
| dentist | A person qualified to practice dentistry. <i>His mouth is still sore from his visit to the dentist s.</i> |
| dermatologist | A medical practitioner qualified to diagnose and treat skin disorders. <i>Visit your dermatologist yearly for a full body skin check.</i> |
| diagnose | Identify the nature of (an illness or other problem) by examination of the symptoms. <i>She was finally diagnosed as having epilepsy.</i> |
| doctor | Alter the content of (food or drink) by adding strong or harmful ingredients. <i>He denied doctoring Stephen s drinks.</i> |
| ferret | Hunt with ferrets. <i>She ferreted out the truth.</i> |
| forefoot | Each of the front feet of a four-footed animal. |
| homeopathy | A system of complementary medicine in which ailments are treated by minute doses of natural substances that in larger amounts would produce symptoms of the ailment. |

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| hospital | A medical institution where sick or injured people are given medical or surgical care. <i>Christ's Hospital.</i> |
| massage | Give a massage to. <i>A massage will help loosen you up.</i> |
| medic | A paramedic in the armed forces. |
| medicinal | A medicinal substance. <i>Medicinal properties.</i> |
| midwife | Assist (a woman) during childbirth. <i>These women midwifed her.</i> |
| orthopedist | A specialist in correcting deformities of the skeletal system (especially in children). |
| osteopath | A therapist who manipulates the skeleton and muscles. |
| pediatrics | The branch of medicine concerned with the treatment of infants and children. |
| pet | A fit of petulance or sulkiness especially at what is felt to be a slight. <i>A pet cat.</i> |
| pharmacist | A health professional trained in the art of preparing and dispensing drugs. |
| physician | A person who cures moral or spiritual ills; a healer. <i>Our family physician.</i> |
| practitioner | A person actively engaged in an art, discipline, or profession, especially medicine. <i>Patients are treated by skilled practitioners.</i> |
| preferred | Preferred above all others and treated with partiality. <i>Danny's preferred name is Dan.</i> |
| prescribe | (medicine) order the use of (a treatment, medicine, etc.), usually by written prescription. <i>The doctor prescribed steroids for my ear trouble.</i> |
| pug | Small compact smooth-coated breed of Asiatic origin having a tightly curled tail and broad flat wrinkled muzzle. |
| puppy | A young dog. <i>You ungrateful puppy.</i> |
| veterinarian | A person qualified to treat diseased or injured animals; a veterinary surgeon. |
| veterinary | A doctor who practices veterinary medicine. <i>A veterinary nurse.</i> |
