## Associations of "Vetting" (30 Words)

<b>anesthetize</b>	Administer an anesthetic drug to. <i><b>Anesthetize</b> the gum before extracting the teeth.</i>
<b>avian</b>	Relating to birds. <i><b>Avian</b> tuberculosis.</i>
<b>badger</b>	A native or resident of Wisconsin. <i>Tom had finally <b>badgered</b> her into going.</i>
<b>bulldog</b>	Wrestle (a steer) to the ground by holding its horns and twisting its neck. <i>Cowboys compete in <b>bulldogging</b> and bareback riding.</i>
<b>chiroprapist</b>	A specialist in care for the feet. <i>She decided to train as a <b>chiroprapist</b>.</i>
<b>dentist</b>	A person qualified to practice dentistry. <i>His mouth is still sore from his visit to the <b>dentist</b> s.</i>
<b>dermatologist</b>	A medical practitioner qualified to diagnose and treat skin disorders. <i>Visit your <b>dermatologist</b> yearly for a full body skin check.</i>
<b><u>diagnose</u></b>	Identify the nature of (an illness or other problem) by examination of the symptoms. <i>She was finally <b>diagnosed</b> as having epilepsy.</i>
<b>doctor</b>	Alter the content of (food or drink) by adding strong or harmful ingredients. <i>He denied <b>doctoring</b> Stephen s drinks.</i>
<b>ferret</b>	Hunt with ferrets. <i>She <b>ferreted</b> out the truth.</i>
<b>forefoot</b>	Each of the front feet of a four-footed animal.
<b>homeopathy</b>	A system of complementary medicine in which ailments are treated by minute doses of natural substances that in larger amounts would produce symptoms of the ailment.

<b>hospital</b>	A medical institution where sick or injured people are given medical or surgical care. <i>Christ's <b>Hospital</b>.</i>
<b>massage</b>	Give a massage to. <i>A <b>massage</b> will help loosen you up.</i>
<b>medic</b>	A paramedic in the armed forces.
<b>medicinal</b>	A medicinal substance. <i><b>Medicinal</b> properties.</i>
<b>midwife</b>	Assist (a woman) during childbirth. <i>These women <b>midwifed</b> her.</i>
<b>orthopedist</b>	A specialist in correcting deformities of the skeletal system (especially in children).
<b>osteopath</b>	A therapist who manipulates the skeleton and muscles.
<b>pediatrics</b>	The branch of medicine concerned with the treatment of infants and children.
<b>pet</b>	A fit of petulance or sulkiness especially at what is felt to be a slight. <i>A <b>pet</b> cat.</i>
<b>pharmacist</b>	A health professional trained in the art of preparing and dispensing drugs.
<b>physician</b>	A person who cures moral or spiritual ills; a healer. <i>Our family <b>physician</b>.</i>
<b>practitioner</b>	A person actively engaged in an art, discipline, or profession, especially medicine. <i>Patients are treated by skilled <b>practitioners</b>.</i>
<b>preferred</b>	Preferred above all others and treated with partiality. <i>Danny's <b>preferred</b> name is Dan.</i>
<b>prescribe</b>	(medicine) order the use of (a treatment, medicine, etc.), usually by written prescription. <i>The doctor <b>prescribed</b> steroids for my ear trouble.</i>
<b>pug</b>	Small compact smooth-coated breed of Asiatic origin having a tightly curled tail and broad flat wrinkled muzzle.
<b>puppy</b>	A young dog. <i>You ungrateful <b>puppy</b>.</i>
<b>veterinarian</b>	A person qualified to treat diseased or injured animals; a veterinary surgeon.
<b>veterinary</b>	A doctor who practices veterinary medicine. <i>A <b>veterinary</b> nurse.</i>
