Definitions of "Vexatious" as an adjective

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "vexatious" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- Causing or tending to cause annoyance, frustration, or worry.
- Causing irritation or annoyance.
- Denoting an action or the bringer of an action that is brought without sufficient grounds for winning, purely to cause annoyance to the defendant.

Synonyms of "Vexatious" as an adjective (24 Words)

annoying Causing irritation or annoyance.

Unsolicited calls are **annoying**.

bothersome Causing irritation or annoyance.

Most childhood stomach aches though **bothersome** aren t serious.

displeasing Causing annoyance or dissatisfaction; disagreeable.

exasperating Intensely irritating and frustrating.

⁹ His cavelier curtness of manner was **exasperating**.



galling Causing irritation or annoyance.

Found it **galling** to have to ask permission.

gratingUnpleasantly harsh or grating in sound.

The continual praise of the good old days can become **grating**.

Characterized by or using aggressive pressure or intimidation.

harassing The employee may feel paranoid even when the **harassing** party is not in

the room.

infuriating Extremely annoying or displeasing.

That **infuriating** half smile on his face.

irksome So lacking in interest as to cause mental weariness.

What an **irksome** task the writing of long letters is.

irritating Serving to stimulate or excite.

Bites of black flies are more than **irritating** they can be very painful.

Making or causing a harsh and irritating sound.

The van came to a **jarring** halt.

maddening Extremely annoying or displeasing.

The ceaseless tumult of the jukebox was **maddening**.

nettlesome Causing annoyance or difficulty.

Nettlesome regional disputes.

niggling (informal) small and of little importance.

A dispute over **niggling** details.

Causing irritation or annoyance.

A **pesky** younger brother.

pestering Causing irritation or annoyance.

Swarms of **pestering** gnats.

pestiferous Harbouring infection and disease.

The **pestiferous** area around the prison.

Causing irritation or annoyance.

plaguey

Plaguey fevers.

Troublesome or annoying.

It was crazy to hope that good might come out of this **plaguy** mess.

provoking Giving rise to the specified reaction or emotion.

Laughter **provoking**.

Playfully vexing (especially by ridicule)- Lawrence Durrell.

Teasing comments.

tiresome Causing one to feel bored or annoyed.

Weeding is a **tiresome** but essential job.



troublesome

Causing difficulty or annoyance.

Schools are removing **troublesome** pupils.

vexing

Causing annoyance, frustration, or worry.

The most **vexing** questions for policymakers.
